- 1. To administer affairs of the State so that public needs are met and maximum benefit is effected from available public resources.
- 2. To assure that the laws of the State are faithfully executed.
- 3. To serve as Commander-In-Chief of all military and naval forces of the State.
- 4. To make appointments and fill vacancies in accordance with legal requirements.
- 5. To approve or disapprove legislation.
- 6. To grant pardons and reprieves in all cases other than impeachment and treason.
- 7. To supervise each department and agency of the State.
- 8. To represent the State in relations with other governments and the public.

Program Classification

O1. Executive Management—In accordance with provisions of the State Constitution, the Governor is elected by the legally qualified voters of this State and is the principal executive and administrative officer of the State. He administers the affairs of the State so that public needs are met and maximum benefit is attained. The Governor appoints executive and judicial officers pursuant to law, supervises the administration of the executive branch, presides at regularly scheduled cabinet meetings with department heads, executes the laws, serves as Commander-In-Chief of the military and naval forces of the State, grants pardons and reprieves, convenes the Legislature, communicates to the Legislature concerning the condition of the State and recommends measures, submits the annual State budget to the Legislature, and approves or vetoes legislation either conditionally or absolutely.
