#### TO ALL DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES

Attention is directed to section one of the Appropriations Act (P.L. 1998, c.45) with reference to the availability of the appropriations for the period of one month after the close of said period fiscal year. State officers are advised that, by reason of the enactment of this clause, all unexpended balances will lapse, unless otherwise provided, at the close of the one–month period unless they are reserved as provided therein.

Transmittals of funds deposited by each State agency shall be forwarded to the Division of Budget and Accounting in accordance with existing regulations. Each State agencies' deposits will be credited to the appropriate account. Receipts which may be appropriated to any State agency may be expended only in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

State agencies shall forward bills for payment as soon as practicable. Every effort will be made by the Department of the Treasury to facilitate payment, particularly those bills subject to discount.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. The appropriations herein or so much thereof as may be necessary are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund, or such other sources of funds specifically indicated or as may be applicable, for the respective public officers and spending agencies and for the several purposes herein specified for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 1999. Unless otherwise provided, the appropriations herein made shall be available during said fiscal year and for a period of one month thereafter for expenditures applicable to said fiscal year. Unless otherwise provided, at the expiration of said one-month period, all unexpended balances shall lapse into the State Treasury or to the credit of trust, dedicated or non-State funds as applicable, except those balances held by encumbrances on file as of June 30, 1999 with the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting or held by pre-encumbrances on file as of June 30, 1999 as determined by the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting. The Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting shall provide the Legislative Budget and Finance Officer with a listing of all pre-encumbrances outstanding as of July 31, 1999 together with an explanation of their status. Nothing contained in this section or in this act shall be construed to prohibit the payment due upon any encumbrance or pre-encumbrance made under any appropriation contained in any appropriation act of the previous year or years. Furthermore, balances held by pre-encumbrances as of June 30, 1998 are available for payments applicable to fiscal year 1998 as determined by the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting. The Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting shall provide the Legislative Budget and Finance Officer with a listing of all pre-encumbrances outstanding as of July 31, 1998 together with an explanation of their status. On or before December 1, 1998, the State Treasurer, in accordance with the provisions of section 37 of article 3 of P.L. 1944, c. 112 (C.52:27B-46), shall transmit to the Legislature the Annual Financial Report of the State of New Jersey for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998, depicting the financial condition of the State and the results of operation for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998.
