Individuals became sick after consuming mushrooms picked from the wild (e.g., backyards, parks). Any calls for persons having consumed wild mushrooms with or without critical signs/symptoms should be evaluated. Callers should be conferenced to Poison Control for assistance (1-800-222-1222). *Local health department should be notified.	Zika Signs and symptoms fever, rash, joint pain, and conjunctivitis (red eyes).
