IN THE MATTER OF THE PETITION OF COMCAST OF SOUTH JERSEY, LLC FOR A RENEWAL CERTIFICATE OF APPROVAL TO CONTINUE TO CONSTRUCT, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN A CABLE TELEVISION SYSTEM IN AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF PENNS GROVE, COUNTY OF SALEM, STATE OF NEW JERSEY OFFICE OF CABLE TELEVISION AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS

On May 17, 1982, the Board of Public Utilities ("Board") granted Penn Communications a Certificate of Approval ("Certificate") in Docket No. 8112-6857, for the construction, operation, and maintenance of a cable television system in the Borough of Penns Grove ("Borough"). Due to a series of Board-approved transfers, the Certificate was held by South Jersey Cablevision Associates ("SJCA"). On April 8, 1994, the Board issued a Renewal Certificate of Approval to SJCA for the Borough, in Docket No. CE93040131. Due to an additional series of Board-approved transfers, the Certificate was held by Comcast Cablevision of South Jersey, Inc. ("Comcast"). On May 5, 2005, the Board issued a Renewal Certificate is Comcast of South Jersey, LLC ("Petitioner"). Although the Petitioner's above-referenced Certificate expired on May 17, 2017, the Petitioner is authorized to continue to provide cable television service to the Borough pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:5A-25, pending disposition of proceedings regarding the renewal of its Certificate of Approval.

On April 17, 2017, the Petitioner notified the Borough of its intention to exercise its right under the automatic renewal provision of the Borough's municipal consent and the Renewal Certificate of Approval. On June 20, 2017, the Petitioner filed with the Board for Automatic Renewal of its

Certificate of Approval for the Borough, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:5A-16, 19, and 25 and N.J.A.C. 14:17-6.9 and 14:18-13.6. The filing indicates that the Borough's ordinance granting municipal consent to the Petitioner provided for an initial term of fifteen (15) years with an automatic renewal term of ten (10) years.

The petition for Automatic Renewal is based on the Borough's February 19, 2002 adopted ordinance granting renewal municipal consent to the Petitioner. On February 22, 2002, the Petitioner accepted the ordinance, which provided, in part, for an automatic renewal term of ten (10) years.

The Board has reviewed the petition for an Automatic Renewal Certificate of Approval and the Application filed therein by the Petitioner. Based upon this review and the recommendation of the Office of Cable Television and Telecommunications, the Board <u>HEREBY</u> FINDS the following:

- 1. The Petitioner possesses the requisite legal, character, financial, and technical qualifications for the awarding of a Certificate of Approval, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:5A-22 to 29, N.J.A.C. 14:18-13-1 to -9.
- 2. The design and technical specifications of the system shall ensure that the Petitioner provides safe, adequate, and proper service.
- 3. The Petitioner has represented that all previously required construction within the franchise territory is complete.
- 4. The franchise period as stated in the ordinance is ten (10) years, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:5A-19 and 25. The Board finds this franchise period reasonable.
- 5. The Borough has reserved the right to review the performance of the Petitioner with regard to the ordinance and seek redress administratively through the Board. If the Borough determines that the Petitioner has failed to substantially comply with the material terms and conditions of the ordinance, the Borough shall provide written notice to the Petitioner of such alleged instances of non-compliance and shall grant the Petitioner ninety (90) days to cure such deficiency. The Borough may petition the Board for appropriate administrative action, including revocation of the franchise or reduction of the franchise term.
- 6. The Petitioner shall provide service along any public right-of-way to any person's residence or business located in all areas of the Borough at tariffed rates for standard and nonstandard installation. For all other circumstances, the Petitioner shall utilize the line extension policy ("LEP") attached to the Certificate. The minimum homes per mile figure is thirty-five (35).
- 7. The Petitioner's rates shall be regulated and tariffs shall be filed for all services, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission, the Board, and the Office of Cable Television and Telecommunications. The Petitioner shall maintain and file with the Board informational schedules of prices, terms, and conditions for unregulated service and promptly file any revisions thereto.
- 8. Pursuant to statutory requirements, the ordinance specifies a complaint officer to receive and act upon complaints filed by subscribers in the Borough. In this case, it is the Office of Cable Television and Telecommunications. All complaints shall be received and processed in accordance with any applicable rules.

- The Petitioner shall maintain a local business office or agent for the purpose of receiving, investigating, and resolving complaints. Currently, the local office is located at 2160 North Second Street, Millville, New Jersey.²
- 10. The franchise fee to be paid to the Borough is specified to be two percent (2%) of the Petitioner's gross revenues from all recurring charges in the nature of subscription fees paid by subscribers for its cable television reception service in the Borough or any additional amount required by N.J.S.A. 48:5A-30. Additional regulatory fees shall be paid to the State in an amount not to exceed two percent (2%) of Petitioner's gross operating revenues derived from intrastate operations. The Board finds these fees to be reasonable.
- 11. The Petitioner shall provide public, educational, and governmental ("PEG") access services, equipment, and facilities as described in the application and the ordinance. The Petitioner shall continue to provide one (1) system-wide educational and governmental access channel. The Petitioner also maintains a system-wide community bulletin board.
- 12. The Petitioner shall provide or continue to provide Total Preferred cable television service on one (1) outlet, free of charge, to each school in the Borough, specifically Carlton Elementary School and Penns Grove Middle School. To qualify for free installation, the school must be located within 175 feet of the active distribution system. Each additional outlet installed, if any, shall be paid for on a materials plus labor basis by the school requesting service. The Petitioner shall waive monthly service charges for any additional outlets.
- 13. The Petitioner shall provide or continue to provide monthly service of free basic Internet service via high-speed cable modem on one (1) non-networked personal computer to the Carlton Elementary School, and the Penns Grove Middle School. To qualify for free installation, the facility must be located within 175 feet of the active distribution system.³

Based upon these findings, the Board <u>HEREBY CONCLUDES</u>, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:5A-17(a) and 28(c), that the Petitioner has the municipal consent necessary to support the petition; that such consent and issuance thereof are in conformity with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 48:5A-1 to -64; that the Petitioner has complied or is ready, willing, and able to comply with all applicable rules and regulations imposed by or pursuant to State and federal law as preconditions for engaging in the proposed cable television operations; that the Petitioner has sufficient financial and technical capacity; that the Petitioner meets the legal, character, and other qualifications necessary to construct, maintain, and operate the necessary installations, lines, and equipment; and that the Petitioner is capable of providing the proposed service in a safe, adequate, and proper manner.

Therefore, the Petitioner is <u>HEREBY</u> <u>ISSUED</u> this Automatic Renewal Certificate of Approval as evidence of the Petitioner's authority to construct and operate a cable television system within the entirety of the Borough.

³ The Petitioner was required to provide Total Preferred cable television service on one (1) outlet, free of charge, as well as monthly service of free basic Internet service via high-speed cable modem on one (1) non-networked personal computer to the Penns Grove-Carneys Point Library. The Penns Grove-Carneys Point Library permanently closed in November of 2012.

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This Automatic Renewal Certificate is subject to all applicable State and federal laws, the rules and regulations of the Office of Cable Television and Telecommunications, and any such lawful terms, conditions, and limitations as currently exist or may hereafter be attached to the exercise of the privileges granted herein. The Petitioner shall adhere to the operating standards set forth by the Federal Communications Commission's rules and regulations, 47 C.F.R. § 76.1 <u>et seq.</u>, including but not limited to the technical standards 47 C.F.R. § 76.601 through § 76.630. Any modifications to the provisions thereof shall be incorporated into this Certificate.

Failure to comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, and orders of the Board or the Office of Cable Television and Telecommunications or the terms, conditions, and limitations set forth herein may constitute sufficient grounds for the suspension or revocation of this Certificate.

This Automatic Renewal Certificate is issued on the representation that the statements contained in the Petitioner's applications are true, and the undertakings therein contained shall be adhered to and be enforceable unless specific waiver is granted by the Office of Cable Television and Telecommunications pursuant to the authority contained in N.J.S.A. 48:5A-1 to -64.

This Certificate shall expire on May 17, 2027...

APPENDIX "I" Office of Cable Television and Telecommunications Line Extension Policy

Company: Comcast of South Jersey, LLC Municipality: Borough of Penns Grove

A cable operator is required to absorb the cost of extensions to the system in the same proportion that the extension is to the remainder of the system.

Actual subscribers served by the extension are required to absorb the remainder of the cost.

If new subscribers are added to the extension, the cost is adjusted and those who previously paid receive an appropriate rebate.

, 1.	<u># of homes in extension</u> mileage of extension	=	homes per mile ("HPM") of extension
2.	<u>HPM of extension</u> Minimum HPM that company actually constructs in the system*	=	ratio of the density of the extension to the minimum density that the company constructs in the system ("A")
3.	Total cost of building the extension times "A"	=	company's share of extension cost
4.	Total cost of building extension less company's share of extension cost	=	total amount to be recovered from subscribers
5.	Total amount to be <u>recovered from subs</u> Total subscribers in extension	=	each subscriber's share

In any case, the company shall extend its plant along public rights of way to:

- 1. All residences and businesses within 150 aerial feet of the operator's existing plant at no cost beyond the normal installation rate.
- 2. All residences and businesses within 100 underground feet of the operator's plant at no cost beyond the normal installation rate.

^{*} The minimum HPM that the company actually constructs in the system or municipality is the minimum number of homes that the company has historically constructed at its own cost. This is a function of the operator's breakeven point and its rate of return. Unbuilt systems will use the primary service area rather than construction.

The operator's installation policies shall apply to construction beyond the public right of way.

Detailed accounting or financial information to support the minimum HPM shall be supplied to the Office for its approval in such form as required. The minimum HPM shall be updated as appropriate.

When a request for service is received, and unless good cause is shown, cable companies shall:

- 1. Provide a written estimate within thirty (30) days of such a request.
- 2. Begin construction within sixty (60) days of receipt of any deposit monies from potential subscribers.
- 3. Complete construction within six (6) months of receipt of any deposit monies from potential subscribers.
- 4. Inform each home passed along the extension of the potential costs for subscribers.

Subscribers who pay for an extension shall be entitled to rebates in the following manner:

- 1. If the company acquires new subscribers subsequent to the initial calculation of step 5 above, ' the formula will be adjusted and those who have previously paid for the extension will be entitled to an appropriate rebate. In no event shall the amount of the rebate exceed the subscriber's contribution.
- The company shall keep accurate records of the cost of the extension, the amounts paid by subscribers, and any appropriate adjustments.
- 3. The company shall notify subscribers in the extension of their rights and responsibilities concerning the extension.
- 4. Once an individual dwelling has paid its share of the extension cost, future reconnections or installations shall be made at the company's standard rates.
- 5. After a period of five (5) years from the installation of the first dwelling unit in the extension, no further adjustments shall be made. Installations after five (5) years shall be at the company's standard rate.
- 6. Once a subscriber is installed, that person shall not normally be entitled to a refund of any monies paid for the installations, except in accordance with the rebate procedure outlined in this policy.

Definitions

Primary Service Area

The Primary Service Area ("PSA") can be an entire municipality, but in many instances the PSA is a limited area within a community outside of which a line extension policy may apply. The PSA is depicted by a franchise map and narrative, presented and recorded during the franchise proceedings. It normally remains a fixed geographic area throughout the life of the franchise.

Line Extension Survey

Potential subscribers residing outside the PSA who request service are entitled to an estimate of their share of the cost to secure service. When conducting a survey and estimating costs, a cable company should factor in all potential subscribers who could practicably be included in the extension and give consideration to apparent residential construction in areas contiguous to the proposed extension.

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
