Overview:

The NJDEP Site Remediation Program, Publicly Funded Response Element will utilize funding provided by the EPA's Sandy Recovery and Improvement Act of 2013 to investigate and remediate discharges from underground storage tanks that are leaking or potentially leaking as a result of Super Storm Sandy.

Federal Department of Origin:

US Environmental Protection Agency

Federal Requirements / Restrictions:

Funding can only be used to deal with underground storage tanks impacted by Super Storm Sandy: investigation and cleanup of discharges and State oversight costs associated with the removal and cleanup of contamination. 10% State match is required.

Selection Standards:

10 potential high priority sites have been selected for use of these funds from a list of 46 candidates.

Eligibility Standards:

Facilities must have documented impacts from Super Storm Sandy and there must be either a discharge or suspicion of a discharge.

Other Notes:

EPA's Official Guidance entitled, "Guidance To Region 2 For Implementing The LUST Provision Of The Sandy Recovery Improvement Act Of 2013" and dated July 2013 has been received.
