# UNIFORM FIRE CODE REGISTRY SECOND QUARTER - APRIL 2012

Attached is a roster listing the Local Enforcing Agencies (LEAs) responsible for enforcing the Uniform Fire Code within the State of New Jersey as required under (N.J.A.C.5:70-1 et seq.) as of March 31, 2012.

During the year 2012, we will publish three cumulative updates to this Registry consisting solely of changes. Although local jurisdiction is not effective until publication of an Annual or Quarterly Registry, we may assume jurisdiction at any time. Therefore, if jurisdiction is of concern, please call (609) 633-7129 for confirmation.

The next deadline for changes to the Registry is June 30, 2012. After that date, a Third Quarterly Update will be published in July 2012. The next Annual Registry will be published in January 2013.
