Property Description: Asbury Park plans to enhance Asbury Park's historic waterfront, a mixed-use neighborhood at the center of the City's urban renewal efforts, by replacing the old "cobra head" highway styled light fixtures with new energy efficient LED lights along its entire boardwalk, parallel to Ocean Avenue from Asbury Avenue to Deal Lake Drive. The boardwalk is not shown as eligible on the NJ Historic Sites and Properties website established by FEMA (<http://fema.maps.arcgis.com/home/webmap/viewer.html?webmap=189f690086c340df9d0cf2d637252660>) or on the NJ-GeoWeb (<http://njwebmap.state.nj.us/NJGeoWeb/>). However, the National Register listed Asbury Park Convention Hall is located along the boardwalk and beach within the proposed project area. No alterations to any buildings are expected for this project.
