Property Description:	<p>Architecture: Property is occupied by a mixed-use, two-story, brick building with a roughly C-shaped plan and a flat roof constructed in 1951-1952. This building is the last remaining from Newark Housing's original Kretchmer Homes public housing project, demolished 1996-2005.</p> <p>Archeology: Property occupies 2.368-acre parcel within the 4.587-acre Lot 1. It is currently occupied by the extant mixed-use building, a macadam basketball court, and open lot formerly occupied by a four-story public housing apartment building. Property is topographically undistinguished, historically distant from water sources, and experienced extensive ground disturbance during construction of the public housing project in 1951-1952. It has low archeological potential.</p>
