**Subject:** Updated Haz SItE Buffer Layer Issue (Question 11 of Tier 2)

### Important Update:

We just replaced the hazardous sites layer and hazardous sites buffer layer in the GIS app based on the 2<sup>nd</sup> list of sites that have been cleared by DEP. The attribute values in the centroid layer have not yet been updated. This is because the review layers are easier to swap than the edited centroids. But we will be posting an updated centroid layer reflecting the correct hazardous buffer values asap.

In the meantime, the popup attribute table that you have been showing on your maps will say "YES" next to "Hazardous Site Buffer Zone" although the applicant will not show up in a 3000' blue buffer of a haz site (because the site has been cleared and removed). The Map is correct and the popup table is wrong (but being updated).

Please include this email with the file so my QA team will know that this is the reason for the discrepancy. Please refer to the issue and this email in the answer to Question 11. We will clear this up as soon as possible but do not want to slow up your ability to complete and submit applications. Thanks, Bill
