About Human Trafficking – Newsletter #13

Opinions differ on whether the incidence of human trafficking, especially prostitution, increases at major sporting events. As the Super Bowl approaches, we will likely see more stories similar to the one recently published by The Guardian, "Brazil's child sex trade soars as 2014 World Cup nears". But the Global Alliance Against Traffic in Women, in its report titled <u>What's the Cost of a Rumor</u>, presents a critical analysis of human trafficking and seeks to separate myths from facts.

We know that human trafficking – sexual exploitation, forced labor, and servitude – occurs daily. The anti-trafficking education, outreach, and collaborative effort of many entities in New Jersey in the weeks ahead will provide both immediate and long-term benefits. Several upcoming anti-trafficking education and outreach events include:

> <u>January 11, 10 am</u> – A film viewing and discussion will be held on Sex + Money: A National Search for Human Worth, organized by the Junior League of Morristown and held at the Morristown Medical Center.

<u>January 15, 7 pm</u> – "New Jersey's Annual Human Trafficking Awareness Day Observance" will occur at the Bergen Performance Arts Center. This will include a performance of survivor stories written by teens, and performed by teens. More information on this event is at <u>www.NJHumanTrafficking.org</u>.

<u>January 21 – January 31</u> - The New Jersey Office of the Attorney General is sponsoring a series of "Say Something" assemblies at local colleges for middle and high school students. These assemblies seek to educate students and encourage them to speak up about trafficking. School districts are invited to bring students to the assemblies, which will be held in the following nine counties: Atlantic, Bergen, Camden, Hudson, Mercer, Monmouth, Morris, Ocean, and Union.
