WHEREAS, all children deserve and should have the nurturing and guidance of a family that will help them to develop physically and emotionally to their fullest potential; and

WHEREAS, adoption can provide an important sense of belonging and assurance to children, particularly adolescents, sibling groups and children with special needs; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey has finalized over twenty-four hundred adoptions for children in need of forever families over the past three years; and

WHEREAS, to raise awareness and to promote forever families, November 19, 2022 has been declared National Adoption Day;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip D. Murphy, Governor of the State of New Jersey, do hereby proclaim:
