**Program Goal**: The overarching goal of this conference is to use what is known about the risk for adolescent suicide to guide clinical risk assessment and intervention.

#### **Training objectives:**

- 1. Participants will learn current information about the risk factors for adolescent suicidal ideation, attempts and completion.
- 2. Participants will learn how to us this information to formulate clinically meaningful questions in order to clarify suicidal risk.
- 3. Participants will become familiar with the current literature about effective components of intervention for suicidal youth.
- 4. Participants will learn how to use the information about suicidal risk to formulate a treatment plan for the suicidal patient based on best practices.

**About the Presenter: David Brent, MD** grew up in the Philadelphia area, graduated from Pennsylvania State University and Jefferson Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University. Dr. Brent trained in pediatrics at the University of Colorado, in general and child psychiatry at Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic, and completed a master's degree in psychiatric epidemiology at the University of Pittsburgh - School of Public Health. Currently, he is academic chief of child and adolescent psychiatry at Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinics and epidemiology at the University of Pittsburgh - School of Medicine. He co-founded and now directs Services for Teens at Risk (STAR), a Commonwealth of Pennsylvania - funded program for suicide prevention, education of professionals, and the treatment of at-risk youth and their families. His work in the area of suicide has focused on the epidemiology of adolescent suicide and has helped to identify the role of firearms, substance abuse, and affective disorders as risk factors for youth suicide.

Dr. Brent and colleagues at Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic have helped establish the role of cognitive therapy as a treatment for depressed adolescents in an NIMH-funded clinical trial. He has also focused on the familial and genetic aspects of suicide, having found that suicidal behavior clusters in families, and is currently, along with colleagues at New York State Psychiatric Institute, studying how suicidal behavior may be transmitted from parent to child. His work has been funded by the William T. Grant Foundation and the National Institute of Mental Health; he currently directs an NIMH-funded Advanced Center for Interventions and Services Research for Early-Onset Mood and Anxiety Disorders devoted to improving the life course of youth with mood and anxiety disorders and consequently at high risk for suicide.
