Target Population - Example

- Adult victims of domestic violence and their dependent children who are experiencing the co-occurrence of domestic violence and child maltreatment and are involved with Child Protection and Permanency

Activities/Outputs

Activities based on the needs of the target population

What services are you providing/will you provide?

What do these services look like (description)?

Outputs- based on the activities identified

How many people will the activity serve?

How frequently will the activity occur?

How long is each activity?

Example Activities/Outputs

Parent Educational Group:

- Focusing on the impact of domestic violence on a child's behavior
- 2 sessions, 2 hours each
- Series will run 3 times a year
- 50 participate/year
