WHEREAS, the public is concerned about air pollution and supports reducing air pollutants to make New Jersey a cleaner, safer, healthier place to live, work and play; and

WHEREAS, if individuals, businesses, industry and local governments in New Jersey work together along with other states and the federal government, we can achieve clean air; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the serious health and welfare issues associated with air pollution, the federal government has declared the week of May 3, 2010 as National Air Quality Awareness Week;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, CHRIS CHRISTIE, Governor of the State of New Jersey, do hereby proclaim
