### Township of Long Beach Municipal Public Access Plan

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### Introduction

The intent of this document is to provide a comprehensive public access plan for the Township of Long Beach which lays out their vision for providing access to tidal waters and shorelines within the municipal boundary. This Municipal Public Access Plan (MPAP) was developed in accordance with the Coastal Zone Management Rules at N.J.A.C. 7:7E-8.11. This MPAP was developed in collaboration with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), and approved by the NJDEP on <date>. The development and implementation of this MPAP supports the policy of local determination of public access locations and facilities, while safeguarding regulatory flexibility and potential funding opportunities for Long Beach Township.

Public rights of access to, and use of, the tidal shorelines and waters, including the ocean, bays, and tidal rivers, in New Jersey are founded in the Public Trust Doctrine. First set by the Roman Emperor Justinian around A.D. 500 as part of Roman civil law, the Public Trust Doctrine establishes the public's right to full use of the seashore.

Through various judicial decisions, the right of use upheld by the Public Trust Doctrine has been incorporated into many state constitutions and statutes, allowing the public the right to all lands, water and resources held in the public trust by the state, including those in New Jersey. The NJDEP adopted new rules governing public access on November 5, 2012 that enable municipalities to develop and adopt MPAPs to govern public access within their municipality. This MPAP consists of an inventory of public access locations, and plans to preserve and enhance access based on community needs and State standards.

On 12/5/2013 representatives from Long Beach Township met with NJDEP staff to begin the public access planning process. This plan was then developed in collaboration with the NJDEP, various departments within Long Beach Township and their planning consultant, Owen, Little & Associates, Inc. and was distributed for courtesy review by Planning Board on 9/18/2015 and was submitted to the NJDEP on 9/24/2015. Upon receiving approval from the NJDEP on date, the MPAP was incorporated into the Recreation/Open Space Element of the Master Plan by resolution on date, see Appendix 2. All public access decisions made within Long Beach Township after this date will be consistent with this plan.

### **Authority for Municipal Public Access Plans**

The premise of the authorization of MPAPs is that public access to tidal waters is fundamentally linked to local conditions. Municipalities have a better awareness and are more responsive to these conditions than a broader State "one size fits all" mandated public access plan.

The voluntary development of a MPAP by Long Beach Township enables the municipality to better plan, implement, maintain, and improve the provision of public access for its residents and visitors. Also, it informs and/or identifies public access requirements associated with any proposed development or redevelopment project. The MPAP was incorporated into the Recreation/Open Space Element of the municipality's Master Plan, in accordance with the Municipal Land Use Law (N.J.S.A 40:55D).

Upon approval of the MPAP by the NJDEP and incorporation into the Master Plan, Long Beach Township will be responsible for ensuring that public access to tidal waterways along the municipality's shorelines is provided in accordance with this plan. For each new public access project, Long Beach Township will provide NJDEP with a letter confirming its consistency with this MPAP. Any permit issued by the NJDEP will reflect, and ensure that public access requirements are satisfied in accordance with, this plan. Per N.J.A.C. 7:7E -8.11(j)4, Long Beach Township is required to submit a progress report on plan implementation to NJDEP within five (5) years from date of plan adoption.

The sections of this plan as indicated below are prescribed by the Coastal Zone Management Rules, N.J.A.C. 7:7E-8.11. See Appendix 1.

### I. <u>Municipal Public Access Vision</u>

### A. Overview of Municipality

The Township of Long Beach is located on Long Beach Island in Southern Ocean County and is the largest barrier island community in the Barnegat Bay Watershed. The Township has a year round population of 3051 (2010 Census), however, the population increases dramatically in the summer months and can reach 50,000 people. With a total area of 22.0 square miles, of which 16.7 square miles is water, the Township is situated geographically to enjoy the benefits of the associated oceanfront and bayfront shorelines. Long Beach Township is void of any major industry or farmland and is considered full developed with the exception of small infill lots or new lots created by subdivision. Given the dense population during the summer months, maintenance of existing public access locations along the Barnegat Bay and the Atlantic Ocean is paramount.

### 1. Public Access Description

Public Access in Long Beach Township is provided by the municipality and consists of a variety access points and facilities including beach walkways, bathroom facilities, lifeguarded beaches, surfing and fishing beaches as well as parks, playgrounds and piers. Long Beach Township protects and ensures public access through conservation easements, ordinances and beach fees. For example, many of the open spaces or areas that provide access to tidal water are regulated by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's Green Acres Program and additional ordinances are in effect to guide the use of these parcels. Also, the ordinances assist in guiding development of particular parcels unregulated by the Green Acres Program and provide regulation for same. Beach fees are collected for beach users at a daily, weekly or seasonal rate and the type of tag purchased is the decision of the purchaser, not the Township.

The overall goal of this MPAP is to establish the Town of Long Beach Township's plan to maintain and enhance all existing public access locations to and along tidal waterways and their shores.

### 2. Map 1. Long Beach Township Tidal Waterways and Lands

Map 1 (Appendix 6a) shows all the tidal waterways within the municipality and all lands held by the municipality. More specifically, Long Beach Township's tidal waterways consist of the Atlantic Ocean to its east, the Barnegat Bay Watershed to its west and the Beach Haven Inlet to the extreme south. In this area of the Barnegat Bay, the waters are delineated into specific bays which can be referenced through NOAA Marine Navigational Charts. The bay is called specifically the Barnegat Bay at the north end of the island while the waters adjacent to the North Beach Section are considered the Manahawkin Bay. Little Egg Harbor Bay is adjacent to the Brant Beach section of the Township while the Beach Haven Inlet can be found at the extreme southernmost tip of Long Beach Island adjacent to Holgate. Various lagoons also line the Bayfront shorelines of the barrier island.

### B. Municipal **Public** Access Goals and **Objectives**

### 1. Goals & Objectives

- i. Participate in programs, both federal and state, that preserve environmentally critical, sensitive or beneficial parcels of land
- ii. Promote the continued balance of land uses while ensuring adequate open space and unrestricted access remains.
- iii. Maintain and continue to promote a visually pleasing aesthetic along the waterfront areas
- Upgrade existing municipal park facilities iv.
- Remain motivated to increase and improve public access locations V.

In addition to those goals outlined within the Master Plan, Long Beach Township establishes the following State required goals specifically for public access:

- vi. All existing public access shall be maintained to the maximum extent practicable.
- vii. Maintain safe and adequate access locations for fishing in those areas where fishing is safe and appropriate.
- viii. Provide clear informative signage for access locations.

Long Beach Township's Municipal Public Access Plan embraces and reflects these goals and will help preserve, protect, and enhance the public's ability to access the Public Trust lands which surround the City. The previous goals are compliant with the New Jersey Coastal Zone Management Rules (see N.J.A.C 7:7E-1.1 (c)).

### 2. Municipal Master Plan Consistency

The goals and objectives provided in this Municipal Public Access Plan have been reviewed and are consistent with the Long Beach Township Master Plan.

Specifically, the Conservation Element of the Master Plan states the following: "The beaches of Long Beach are vital to the environmental and physical protection of the Township, as well as being one of its most valuable economic resources. The beaches are the first line of protection from storms approaching from the sea. Like all coastal communities, Long Beach Township recognizes the fragility of dunes and has invested heavily in the research and analysis of Beach Replenishment Projects. In addition, special land use ordinances have been adopted to limit further encroachments along the beach strand.

In 2017, Long Beach Township intends to develop a new Master Plan which will incorporate public access and address the coastal vulnerabilities associated with these locations. The Township is known regionally as a trailblazer for initiatives involving sustainability, resiliency and issues surrounding its waterways.

### II. Public Access


### A. Public Access Locations

### C. Limitations to Public Access

The following limitations to public access currently exist:

### 1. Temporary Restrictions

Long Beach Township provides 250 access points to its tidal waters which equates to approximately 45 access points per square mile in this shore community. The vast majority of access points are located on bayfront street ends or ocean blocks while other access points are provided via public parks or access easements.

Long Beach Township does utilize beach badges, commonly referred to as 'beach tags', to monitor beach access and establish regulation to ensure continued effectiveness of the beach and dune system as a line of defense from coastal storms. More specifically, beach badges are required to be worn June 15th through September 15th from 10am until 5pm. This is typically the time all beaches are also lifeguarded.

Additional temporary restrictions may come by way of dangerous or hazardous water conditions when lifeguards determine there is a risk to public safety and therefore prohibit bathing on particular beaches.

As Long Beach Township continues its participation in the Long Beach Island Storm Damage Reduction and Beach Replenishment Project, restrictions to public access on the oceanfront may occur but will be minor in nature and only last a few days.

### 2. Permanent Restrictions

There are no known restrictions to established public access points in Long Beach Township.

### III. Community Needs Assessment

Long Beach Township has performed a community needs assessment. The methods and results are described in the following section:

Analysis of the collected data indicates that adequate public access is provided to the tidal waters adjacent to Long Beach Township. In addition, in the past five (5) years, Long Beach Township has initiated and completed numerous bulkhead projects at street ends to ensure shoreline stability and a safe point of access to the waterfront as well as rehabilitated or reconstructed bayside and oceanfront facilities to provide additional services to those utilizing them. In particular, a project was recently completed at Bayview Park in the Brant Beach Section of the Township which was significantly impacted by Superstom Sandy. This project included revitalizing the bay beach area, reconstructing the boardwalk, construction of a new playground and an upgraded parking lot. The Township is always looking for way to increase and improve public access.

The Township has embraced a vision a providing increased passive a recreational opportunities as well as waterfront access for different age groups at its Township –owned park facilities. Improvements such as adding a playground equipment, park benches and expanding beach areas where appropriate would help improve the local recreational facility offerings. The increase in seasonal population has warranted an expansion of current facilities throughout the community. Unlike other municipalities in the state, Long Beach Township is unique in that all recreational facilities can be accessed via different types of pedestrian oriented modes such as cycling or walking. In turn, this maximizes the potential use of the facilities by the local population. Municipal stakeholders feel its important to continue park and access point rehabilitation projects to avoid a deterioration in the existing infrastructure.

### IV. Implementation Plan

Long Beach Township has created an Implementation Plan composed of Priorities, Preservation of Public Access Locations, Signage, Proposed Access Improvements and Facilities, and Municipal Tools for Implementation as described in the following section:

### A. Priorities

Long Beach Township developed the following priorities:

### 1. Maintain Existing Public Access

The Township Department of Public Works routinely checks access points to ensure that they are free from barriers and remain safe for users. Additional signage may be installed at particular access points to advise the general public of their availability.

In addition, throughout the summer months, various programs are held within the Township which promotes access and utilization of the tidal waters. For example, Bayview Park offers daily activities such as kayak tours and standup paddle boarding demonstrations to those interested. These tours and demonstrations launch from the Bayview Park Beach and allows new users to familiarize themselves with not only the bay in that area but also the characteristics of the launch site. This develops experience with bay-goers and promotes a more responsible user.

### a. Tools

A schedule of events promoting activities with the Barnegat Bay and the Atlantic Ocean are widely available throughout Long Beach Township and are also available online.

### b. Cost and Funding

Funding is appropriated at time of budget each year.

### 2. Preserving Public Access

In an effort to preserve public access, Long Beach Township is continuously seeking funding opportunities to assist with off setting the cost of access point and recreational park projects. To this effect, the Township was offered loan through the New Jersey Green Acres Program for Multi-Park Upgrades at various facilities throughout the community. As the result of Superstorm Sandy and associated recovery projects, the Township Commissioners declined the loan in June 2013 as it was not economically prudent at that time. However, some of the projects which were included in that park plan have since been completed while others remain to either be budgeted for within the Township Budget or other funding means sought.

### a. Tools

The New Jersey Green Acres Local Assistance Program Park Development Plan is a source of priority projects established by community leaders to ensure continued access to public access locations and facilities. In detail, since 2013 the Township has offered the following to promote and preserve public access:

### **Completed Projects**

### Bayview (Bayfront) Park and Bay Beach

- Undersized Basketball Courts were removed at the south end of the property and the beach area was expanded. In addition, the Township partnered with the non-profit organization "Where Angels Play Foundation" to construct a new playground after the existing playground was destroyed by Superstorm Sandy.

### **Loveladies Beach Access/Tennis Court**

- The existing handicap beach access ramp was rehabilitated and expanded to the oceanfront beach area and the tennis court was also reconstructed to current design standard.

### **Proposed Projects**

### New Jersey Avenue Bay Beach (West 131st Street)

- Proposed plans include improving the existing Bayfront gazebo with a new roof and adding benches as well as bathroom facilities. A new bulkhead design has been completed and is ready to be bid to an interested contractor as of the date of this plan.

### Holgate Bay Beach and Park (Joan Avenue Streetend)

- Proposed plans include adding additional playground equipment, benches and picnic benches.

### Bayview (Bayfront) Park and Bay Beach

Proposed plans include expanding the existing restrooms and constructing new changing rooms as well as rebuilding and existing gazebo at the south end of the park. Recently, the Ocean County Department of Engineering completed a new stormwater mitigation project along Long Beach Boulevard in the area of Bayview Park and constructed and outfall pipe near the north end of the park. As a result and to take advantage of the piling now available, the Township plans to construct a recreational dock/pier over the outfall pipe. It has yet to be determined of the pier will be conducive for fishing but it will at least be another public access point for members of the community.

### b. Cost and Funding

Costs and funding sources have not been made available at this time.

### 3. Proposed Locations and Facilities

As a condition to the Army Corps of Engineers Long Beach Island Storm Damage Reduction Project and as noted on Map 4, the following additional access points are proposed in the North Beach and Loveladies sections of the Township:

### **D.** Army Corps of Engineers Requirements for Shore Protection Projects Long Beach Township has met the ACOE Requirements as follows:

### V. Relationship to the Other Regional and State Plans

Long Beach Township's MPAP has been reviewed for consistency and has the following relationship to the New Jersey State Development and Redevelopment Plan, prepared by the New Jersey State Planning Commission and Adopted March 1, 2001:

• Coastal Resource Planning Policy #5 promotes "well-planned and revitalized coastal communities that sustain economies, are compatible with the natural environment, minimize the risks from natural hazards and provide access to coastal resources for the public use and enjoyment."

Long Beach Township supports this policy and has initiated a Coastal Vulnerability Assessment Study of its public access points and various critical facilities to ensure community leaders and decision makers have a clear understanding of potential future hazard risk to its access locations and to provide a resource which can be utilized to develop future resiliency projects.

 Coastal Resource Planning Policy #11 seeks to "promote recreational opportunities and public access, and encourage tourism along the oceanfront, bay front and rivers of the coastal area by protecting public access rights."

Its estimated that as many as 50,000 people are within the boundaries of Long Beach Township on a given day in the summer months. These people are comprised of year round residents, seasonal residents, day trippers and vacationers and most all seek to enjoy the amenities associated with coastal living. Long Beach Township has established a reputation for hosting various programs focusing on its tidal waters such as kayak tours, paddleboard demonstrations, lifeguard in training programs amongst others.

### VI. Resolution of Incorporation

Upon approval of this plan by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Long Beach Township will approve a final resolution to incorporate this Municipal Public Access Plan into the Conservation Element of the Long Beach Township Mater Plan. The Final Resolution will mimic the draft Resolution provided in Appendix 1 of this plan,


### APPENDIX 5 Sign Ordinance

### § 64-17 Dune walkways.

- A. Permit required. Before any work of the type described in this section may begin, a building permit must be applied for and obtained after submission of plans and specifications so in compliance with the provisions hereof; and the work and progress shall be subject to inspection by the Code Enforcement Officer to assure compliance therewith.
- B. Construction specification. After the effective date of this ordinance, [1] all dune walkways shall be constructed of prefabricated rollaway decking, except as hereinafter provided in Subsection C. Such walkways shall extend over the complete dune area to the flat beach. The walkway shall not be greater than four feet in width. In addition to the prefabricated rollaway decking, signs shall be placed on posts of treated lumber or cedar measuring four inches by four inches extending at least three feet below the surface of the dune and at least four feet above the surface of the dune on which signs shall be placed stating "cross the dune only on this walkway provided, no trespassing on the dune." The posts shall be placed on the flat beach end of the walkway with the required signs facing away from the walkway and shall also be placed on the westerly end of the walkway with the signs facing away from the walkway. The flat surface of the sign shall be as close as possible to a ninety-degree angle from the surface of the walkway.
  - [1]: Editor's Note: "This ordinance" refers to Ord. No. 07-33C.
- C. Any dune walkways which are required to be removed pursuant to the United States Army Corps of Engineers Beach Storm Damage Reduction Project may only be replaced pursuant to the construction standards hereinabove set forth in Subsection B and in compliance with any regulations adopted by the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the United States Army Corps of Engineers in connection with such restoration and protection program.
- D. Any existing dune walkovers which are registered with the Building Department prior to 4:00 p.m. Friday August 24, 2007, may be maintained. Upon registration and inspection, a certificate of compliance will be issued by the Construction Department permitting the property owner to continue the maintenance of such walkovers.
- E. Required fees. All existing walkovers being registered on or before August 24, 2007, which are not shown in the construction files of Long Beach Township shall be required to apply for and pay for the appropriate zoning and building permit as required by the Long Beach Township Construction Department.


6a Map 1 – Long Beach Township Tidal Waterways and Lands


6c Map 3 – Long Beach Township's Enhanced Public Access Locations


