

CAFRA Centers expiring in whole or in part due to operation of the State Planning rules and the Permit Extension Act

Atlantic County

A. Galloway Township

1. Oceanville Regional Center village: A Critical Environmental Site (CES), located in the southwestern corner of the center associated with the Oceanville Bog Natural Heritage Program priority site, reverts to the Coastal Rural Planning Area.

2. Smithville Regional Center town: Portions of the center revert to the Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area. These areas include the stream corridor and associated wetlands of Nacote Creek along the northern center boundary, and vacant forested lands adjacent to the Edwin Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge along the western border of the center south of Glory Road.

3. Smithville Regional Center core: A small portion of the core, located in its most northerly extent, reverts to the Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

4. Wrangleboro CAFRA town: Stream corridors and wetlands associated with Nacote Creek and Mattix Run located along the eastern center boundary, and wetlands and stream corridor associated with the Morses Mill Branch of Nacote Creek along the northern center boundary revert to the Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area. A CES that delineates the Port Republic Natural Heritage Program priority site, located in the northern portion of the center, reverts to the Coastal Rural and Environmentally Sensitive Planning Areas.

Cape May County

A. Wildwood City/North Wildwood City/Wildwood Crest Borough/West Wildwood Borough CAFRA regional center: A bay island in Wildwood Crest that is comprised of wetlands reverts to the Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

B. Cape May City CAFRA town: The entire town reverts to Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

C. Cape May Point CAFRA village: The entire village reverts to Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

Cumberland County

A. Bridgeton CAFRA regional center: A corridor along the Cohansey River, located in the extreme southern end of the center, reverts to the Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

B. Cedarville CAFRA village, Lawrence Township: A narrow corridor located along Cedar Creek that bisects the CAFRA village reverts to the Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

C. Millville-Vineland CAFRA regional center: A small section of the center along the Maurice River reverts to the Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

D. Commercial Township

1. Laurel Lake CAFRA village: The entire village reverts to Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

2. Port Norris CAFRA village: The entire village reverts to Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

E. Maurice River Township

1. Mauricetown Station CAFRA hamlet: Nearly all reverts to Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area. The only exception is a within a State Wildlife Management Area.

2. Delmont CAFRA village: The entire village reverts to Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

3. Dorchester-Leesburg CAFRA village: The entire village reverts to Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

4. Heislerville CAFRA village: The entire village reverts to Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

5. Port Elizabeth Bricksboro CAFRA village: The entire village reverts to Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.

Monmouth County

A. Atlantic Highlands CAFRA town: Two CESs delineated along the Raritan Bay shore revert to the Coastal Metropolitan Planning Area.

B. Long Branch City CAFRA regional center: CES are delineated along the Atlantic Ocean beach, the Shrewsbury River, Manhasset Creek, Whalepond Brook and Lake Takanassee. These areas revert to the Coastal Metropolitan Planning Area.

C. Manasquan Borough CAFRA town: CES are delineated on the Atlantic Ocean beach, Judas Creek, Stockton Lake and Robert Swamp Brook. These areas revert to the Coastal Metropolitan Planning Area.

D. Red Bank CAFRA regional center: An area along the Navesink River shoreline reverts to Coastal Environmentally Sensitive Planning Area.
