To Manufacturers of Covered Electronic Devices (other than televisions):

Pursuant to the “Electronic Waste Management Act” (the Act) P.L.2007, c.347 as amended by P.L. 2008 c.130 (N.J.S.A. 13:1E-99.94 et seq.) the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has determined preliminary numbers regarding the collection obligation for manufacturers of covered electronic devices (other than televisions) (please see Table 1).

For your information, the collection obligation for manufacturers of covered electronic devices (other than televisions) is the total weight of covered electronic devices that a manufacturer is responsible to collect, transport and recycle each program year. The collection obligation in Table 1 below is for the program year beginning January 1, 2011. The Department has determined the preliminary collection obligation numbers by multiplying a manufacturer’s return share (shown in the “% by weight” column), by the gross covered electronic device (other than televisions) recycling goal of 20 million pounds.

The Act requires, at N.J.S.A. 13:1E-99.103e(1), that all manufacturers of other covered electronic devices, with a return share greater than zero, submit a plan to the Department to collect, transport, and recycle covered electronic devices based on the manufacturer's return share.

Please note that manufacturers must submit their collection plans, either individually or as a group, no later than September 30, 2010.

1. A detailed explanation of the grounds for the alternative collection obligation;
2. An alternative calculation;
3. The basis for the alternative calculation
4. Documentary evidence supporting the alternative collection obligation; and
5. Complete contact information for requests for additional information and clarification.

The Department will review any collection obligation comments received and will, by August 31, 2010, publish a Final Collection Obligation Report. The Final Collection Obligation Report will include the final collection obligations and a summary of any comments received and the Department's response to the comments.
