General Permits (GP)

- N.J.A.C. 7:27-8.8 "General Permits"

GP is a pre-approved permit and certificate which applies to a specific class of significant sources

General Permit Workgroup

- Air Permitting
- Field Enforcement
- Technical Services
- Small Business Assistance
- Environmental Justice

WHAT IS A GENERAL PERMIT?

- Applicability - NJAC 7:27-8.8
- Registration-like process
- Pre-approved
- Simple/common source categories
- Fixed set of predefined permit conditions
- Not negotiable

GENERAL PERMITS UNDER DEVELOPMENT

- **GP-004A** Fuel Dispensing Facilities
- **GP-009A** Boilers and/or Indirect Fired Process Heaters Less Than 50 MMBTU/hr
- **GP-021** Combined Heat and Power Combustion Turbines less than or equal to 65 MMBTU per hour
- **GP-022** Combined Heat and Power Stationary Spark Ignition Reciprocating Engine (s) less than or equal to 65 MMBTU per hour

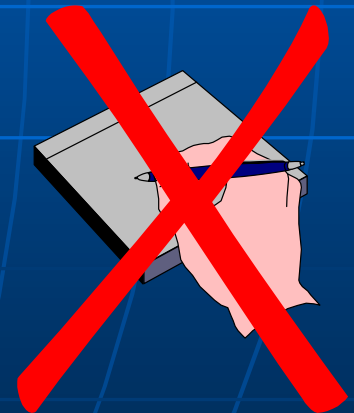

GENERAL EXCLUSIONS

- Source cannot be subject to PSD
- Source cannot be subject to emission offsets
- Facilities with approved Title V Operating Permit cannot use GP (except for GP-019)
- Additional exclusions found in each individual GP

- Certify (Individual With Direct Knowledge & Responsible Official)
- Credit card payment, bank routing number (e-check) or Bill Me Later
