Compliance Advisories

- Compliance & Enforcement has an advisory system to help you quickly recognize the intent of its various outreach efforts.
- Each advisory will follow a common abbreviated format which:



- Outlines the issue.
- Will help you determine if you are affected.
- Describe what you can do.
- Tell you how to get more information.

Preparation for Inspections

• NJDEP - EZ Inspect Guide:

- A guide to assist in understanding the inspection process.
- Not intended to be program/media specific.
- Doesn't contain all regulations and/or requirements.
- Guide focuses on general questions.

For Example:

- What if I am not sure if I am in compliance with the regulations?
- Why is my business being inspected?
- What should I do to be prepared for the inspection?
- How long will the inspection take?
- What kinds of records will the inspector want to look at?
- What are the most common violations that an inspector finds?

Preparation for Inspections

- Air Inspection Checklist:
 - Generic checklist.
 - Helps identify regulated equipment.
 - Helps determine what needs an air permit.

For Example:

- Does the facility perform any surface cleaning operations, either with or without solvents?
- Does the facility burn any waste oil, or any other noncommercial fuel?

- Did you observe any odors or visible emissions at this facility?

DEP Online

Online access to:

- Review your facility information
- Print your Certificates to Operate
- Submit electronic reports (ex: EERs, Annual & Semiannual Compliance Certifications, Annual Combustion Adjustment Reports)
- Pay for permit renewals online
- Apply for new General Permits

NJDEP Greenstart Program

- This compliance assistance program offers help to:
 - Small Businesses
 - Schools
 - Municipalities



- Purpose is to help these groups understand their environmental obligations.
- Designed for businesses with less than 100 employees, but exceptions may be made on a case by case basis.
- Facility Limitations:
 - Can't have a history of serious environmental violations.
 - Can't be involved in any ongoing enforcement action with the NJDEP.
- Program can include an on-site consultation
- If violations are found, penalties may be eliminated Grace periods (up to 90 days) may be granted, allowing you time to achieve compliance.
- However, egregious violations may result in an enforcement action


Affirmative Defense

- Affirmative Defense (AD) to penalty liability may be provided for air pollution violations which result from:
 - a non-recurring equipment malfunction.
 - equipment start-up.
 - equipment shut-down.
 - necessary equipment maintenance.



Affirmative Defense

- AD entitlement criteria include:
 - Facility was being operated with due care.
 - Violation was not caused by operator error.



- Reasonable steps were taken to minimize emissions.
- If malfunction, not part of a recurrent pattern.
- Must meet 2 deadlines for notification/reporting.



Affirmative Defense

- If asserting AD, two deadlines must be met:
 - Notification to the Department Hotline
 (1-877-WARNDEP) by 5:00 pm of the second full day following the occurrence.

AND

- Submit written documentation demonstrating that the criteria for the Affirmative Defense entitlement have been met, to the Regional Office, within 30 days of the occurrence.

Self Disclosure

- Pursuant to Departmental policy (N.J.A.C. 7:33-1 et seq) as well as proposed new rules, a regulated entity may be eligible for a penalty reduction as follows:
 - Tier 1 (Minor) Violations eligible for 100% reduction.
 - Tier 2 (Non-Minor) Violations eligible for 75% reduction.



Self Disclosure

- Conditions for penalty reduction under Self Disclosure include:
 - Violation did not cause serious actual harm to human health/environment, or pose an imminent and substantial danger.
 - Voluntary discovery of the violation.
 - Discovered and disclosed independent of a regulatory agency or third party complaint.
 - Correction of the violations to the Department's satisfaction, which includes implementation of measures to mitigate any harm caused.
 - The violations are not repeat violations, a pattern of illegal conduct, or the result of purposeful, knowing, reckless, or criminal negligence.
 - The facility agrees to take appropriate action to prevent a reoccurrence.
 - Not the result of a failure to take reasonable/appropriate preventive measures.

Self Disclosure

- In order to be eligible for Self Disclosure, violations must be reported within 21 days of discovery.
- Report must be on specific forms.
- Report must be mailed to: NJDEP Compliance and Enforcement PO Box 422

Environmental Stewardship

• ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP ACTIVITIES

- Do any site activities "go beyond" the minimum regulatory requirements and serve as examples of Environmental Stewardship or Sustainability?



Environmental Stewardship

• For Example:

- CARBON FOOTPRINT ANALYSIS - Has the site accounted for all greenhouse gases?

- ENVIRONMENTAL PURCHASING POLICY- Has the site implemented an "Environmental Purchasing Policy" resulting in the purchase of products and office supplies that are recognized as environmentally responsible?

- OUTREACH PROGRAM - Does the site have a outreach program that offers assistance to community leaders, local schools, neighborhood groups, etc. to address, educate and collaborate on environmental issues within the community?

- HAZARDOUS MATERIALS REDUCTION - Has the site implemented a change in operations and/or product formulation resulting in reduction or elimination of hazardous materials used/disposed of at the site?

- RENEWABLE ENERGY USE - Does the site use renewable energy sources? If yes, identify the direct source (solar, wind, bio,etc) or name the CleanPower supplier and characterize the amount.
