What is a Supplement Environmental Project (SEP)?

- Environmentally beneficial project that respondent agrees to perform as part of settlement – Adminstrative Consent Order
- Environment or public health must be primary beneficiary
- Must include measureable environmental benefits

A SEP is NOT

 A project that would have been needed to comply with an enforcement order for a specified source

Used to totally mitigate penalty

How?

- Respondent proposes at time of settlement
- Review by Department for approval/modification/rejection
- Incorporated into binding enforcement agreement (ACO)

Relationship of SEP to violation

- Reduces the adverse impact to health and environment of affected area
- Reduces likelihood that similar violations would reoccur in the future
- Must consider the community impacted, otherwise an indirect SEP can be considered

Impact on Penalty

- For each dollar spent on SEP, one dollar is deducted from the penalty <u>settlement</u> amount up to 75%(50% for WPCA)
 - Example: Penalty \$125,000
 - Settlement: \$100,000
 - SEP amount \$75,000 (75% of settlement)
- 25% of <u>settlement</u> amount (50% for WPCA) must be paid (\$25,000)

Unacceptable for SEP

- Monetary Donation
- DEP or other state agency managing controlling funds
- Any promotion/publication of SEP must clearly indicate that it was completed as part of an enforcement action
