PASSING SCORE

Passing score for the New Jersey Landscape Irrigation Contractor Exam is a 70% overall score with a minimum of 50% in each exam content area.

Individual forms of the exam contain different blends of questions for a variety of reasons, including maintaining security of the program.



Passage of the New Jersey Landscape Irrigation Contractor Examination may also qualify you to become an Irrigation Association Certified Irrigation Contractor (CIC). The Irrigation Association determines the passing score for the CIC exam based on the relative difficulty of each question. This process yields a pass-fail score that is dependent on the questions comprising the individual exam. Depending on the exam, the passing score typically ranges between 68%-75%. It is possible that your score will pass the New Jersey Landscape Irrigation Contractor Examination and fail the IA CIC Examination or visa-versa.
