Dear Bait & Tackle Shop/Marina Contact:

Due to the recent destruction surrounding "Superstorm" Sandy, the Division of Fish and Wildlife (Division) is attempting to develop an initial assessment of the damage to New Jersey's fishing industries and supported businesses. We are requesting this in an attempt to determine the amount of damage you incurred specifically related to your Bait & Tackle Shop and/or Marina.

We would appreciate it if you could please take the time to answer a few questions to get us started. We are considering any loss or damage that occurred since Saturday, October 27, 2012.
