

Blue Crab

Callinectes sapidus



Description:

- olive to blue/green above
- claws bright blue underneath; females have red tipped claws
- shell twice as wide as it is long
- 9 marginal teeth; 9th is a long strong spine
- last pair of legs, called swimmerets, are paddle shaped

Size:

• up to 9 inches from tip to tip of longest spines

Range:

• Cape Cod, Massachusetts to Uruguay

Facts:


- important commercial species
- breed in salt water
- migrate to deeper waters in winter
- females only mate once in their lifetime
- average lifespan is 3 years
