Salmo trutta



Description:

- olive green to brown on top
- creamy, golden-yellow on the sides
- off white on the belly
- covered with black, often red spots along sides, back and dorsal fin
- in larger bodies of water fish tend to be silvery with scattered black spots
- 10 branchiostegal rays
- ♦ 9 dorsal rays

Size:

♦ 12-14 inches, up to 40 inches

Range:

- not native to North America
- native range is British Isles and most of Europe
- introduced all over the world
- widely stocked throughout southern Canada and much of the U.S.

Facts:

- diverse diet, typically insects, fish and crayfish
- ♦ introduced to New York and Michigan from Europe in 1883
- typically found in near-shore waters
