

Carp

Cyprinus carpio



Description:

- 2 barbels on each side of the upper jaw
- deep bodied
- brassy green above
- yellowish white below
- adults have red orange caudal and anal fins

Size:

• up to 48 inches

Range:

- native to Eurasia; introduced to North America in 1831; now widely distributed in
- south Canada and most of the United States; absent in poles and northern Asia


Facts:

- prefer large, slow moving bodies of water, but are hardy and tolerant of a wide variety of habitats
- spawn in spring and early summer
- female lays an average of 300,000 eggs over one season
- after the eggs are scattered and fertilized, there is no further parental care
- average lifespan is 17 to 20 years
- adults have no predators other than humans
- feeding methods decimate macrophytes and decrease overall water quality
