Trinectes maculatus



Description:

- flat, oval body
- small mouth
- no pectoral fins
- dark brown with dark thin bars
- pale underside
- eyes on right side of fish
- dorsal and anal fins stretch from head to tail

Size:

• up to 8 inches

Range:

 Massachusetts to Florida; Gulf of Mexico to Panama

Facts:

- prefer coastal waters
- travel hundreds of miles upstream in freshwater
- spawn inshore from May to September
- larvae go upstream after hatching
- live up to 7 years
- feed on worms and crustaceans
- bottom dwellers
- farmers would feed hogchokers to their hogs and the hogs would often choke on them, hence their name
