
Quick Chek convenience store.

Site History/Background

- Historic site uses/operations included gasoline filling station, machine tool shop, cabinet and furniture making shop, used car lot, motorcycle and automobile repair facility, and residences.
- Petroleum and VO contamination of soil and groundwater resulted from USTs, ASTs, historic on-site solvent and petroleum fuel use, and past hazardous materials management practices.



Areas of Environmental Concern



NJ's Brownfield & Contaminated Site Remediation Act (P.L. 1997 C.278)

- Enacted in 1999 as incentive to Developers to pursue, remediate, and redevelop contaminated properties
- Up to 75% of investigation and remediation costs reimbursed through the generation of new taxes
- Developer must not be responsible for contamination and must finance the investigation and remediation
- Reimbursement is received annually after NFA achieved and sufficient taxes generated by the redeveloped site to off-set incurred costs
- Application process includes pre-application meeting with Brownfields Team, submittal of Feasibility Study/Business Plan, and evaluation/approval by NJEDA, NJDEP, and NJ Dept. of Treasury

Project Timeline

- WAI hired as Environmental Consultant for Due Diligence June 2003
- Quick Chek and NJDEP entered into MOA November 2003
- Rahway Planning Board Approval June 2004
- Quick Chek purchased site August 2004
- Union County Planning Board Approval September 2004
- PA/SI and RIW/RAW Submitted October 2004
- Site Remediation (in conjunction with redevelopment) Late 2004 into Early 2005
- Supplemental Groundwater RI 2005
- Quick Chek Convenience Store and Fueling Station Opened for Business – December 12, 2005
- Groundwater Remediation and Monitoring 2006 to Present
- Soils Only NFA issued October 30, 2008
- Brownfield Reimbursements received December 2008 and September 2010 (\$363,291.06 received to date)

Regulatory Process & Considerations

- Quick Chek Rahway site was managed under NJDEP's prior Voluntary Cleanup Program
- Brownfield reimbursement process is unchanged, however, remediation now under LSRP oversight pursuant to SRRA
- This project benefitted from a joint desire by the City and Developer to see the project move forward as well as cooperation from NJDEP Case Manager (due diligence through construction in 2.5 years)

Corrective Actions

- Registration and Regulated Closure of On-Site USTs
- Contaminated Soil Excavation and Off-Site Disposal
- ConstructionPhase Dewatering
- Monitoring Well Installation and Sampling
- GroundwaterRemediation andMonitoring
- NJDEP Reporting



Redevelopment Challenges

- Previously Unidentified
 Contamination identified beneath
 former building after demolition
- Construction Phase Dewatering and Treatment of Contaminated Groundwater
- Coordination of Remediation with Redevelopment

The Remediated & Redeveloped Site

Site redevelopment activities were completed in December 2005, and the Quick Chek site opened on December 12, 2005.

The Quick Chek convenience store and fueling station site generates some \$540,000 in NJ state sales tax revenue annually (excludes gasoline taxes).
