

Site Remediation Reform Act and LSRP Program

A Revolutionary New Way of Doing Business in NJ

The **Site Remediation Reform Act (SRRA)** provides sweeping changes to the way in which Sites are remediated in New Jersey, and amends other statutes such as the Brownfields and Contaminated Sites Act and the Spill Compensation and Control Act. The SRRA establishes a program for the licensing of **Licensed Site Remediation Professionals (“LSRPs”)** who will have responsibility for oversight of environmental investigation and cleanup. While the new law changes the process of how sites are remediated, it ensures that the same stringent standards required for cleanup remain intact. The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) will retain significant authority over the remediation process and ensure that LSRPs comply with all applicable regulations, but the day-to-day management of site remediation will be the responsibility of the qualified LSRPs.

This one-day program is designed to familiarize practitioners of and those associated with site remediation such as attorneys, property owners, developers, environmental advocates and government officials about the new way of doing remedial business in the Garden State. The newly adopted regulations will be discussed in depth by NJDEP officials who developed them. In addition, an end-of-the-day panel will be lead by the Licensed Site Remediation Professionals Association to guide practitioners and other attendees through their future roles under NJDEP’s Technical Regulations. This will include the impact of the implementing regulations on LSRPs, other stakeholders, and NJDEP.
