What is considered GI?

- Dry Wells
- Pervious Paving Systems
- Vegetative Filter Strips
- Grass Swales
- Green Roofs
- Cisterns
- Small-Scale Bioretention
 - Rain gardens curb bump-outs
 - Planter boxes tree pits

When used to treat runoff close to the source (DA<1 acre):

- Bioretention
 - Bioswales
- Infiltration Basins
- Sand Filters designed to infiltrate

Tier 2 BMPs

- Wet Ponds with at least 50% of the shoreline maintained in at least a 10-foot wide native vegetation and a stormwater runoff retention component designed to capture stormwater runoff for beneficial reuse, such as irrigation
- Constructed Stormwater Wetlands
- Infiltration Basins (no DA limitation)
- Bioretention Systems (no DA limitation)

What is not considered GI?

- Traditional Detention Basins
- Traditional wet ponds
- All currently certified MTDs
- Sand Filters with underdrains
- Subsurface gravel wetlands
