



AMENDMENT TO THE MONMOUTH COUNTY WATER QUALITY
MANAGEMENT PLAN

Public Notice

Take notice that on **FEB 14 1996**, pursuant to the provisions of the New Jersey Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules (N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.4), an amendment to the Monmouth County Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department of Environmental Protection (Department). This amendment proposal was submitted on behalf of the Western Monmouth Utilities Authority (WMUA). The amendment updates the WMUA Wastewater Management Plan (WMP) in Marlboro and Manalapan Townships. The WMP identifies a sewer service area expansion to the Pine Brook Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) to serve the Battleground Country Club in Manalapan Township and the Brooks Edge Development, Sered Associates, The Sanctuary, and Marlboro Memorial sites in Marlboro Township with a projected wastewater planning flow of 265,475 gallons per day for these sites. This brings the projected wastewater planning flow need of the Pine Brook STP to 9.452 million gallons per day (mgd). The present existing and committed flow to the Pine Brook STP is 5.738 mgd with a New Jersey Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permitted flow of 6.6 mgd. Discharge is to the Pine Brook which is classified within the New Jersey Surface Water Quality Standards (N.J.A.C. 7:9B) as a Freshwater 2-Nontrout Waters (FW2-NT).

This amendment represents only one part of the permit process and other issues will be addressed prior to final permit issuance. Additional issues which were not reviewed in conjunction with this amendment but which may need to be addressed may include, but are not limited to, the following: antidegradation; effluent limitations; water quality analysis; exact locations and designs of future treatment works (pump stations, interceptors, sewers, outfalls, wastewater treatment plants); and development in wetlands, flood prone areas, designated Wild and Scenic River areas, or other environmentally sensitive areas which are subject to regulation under Federal or State statutes or rules.
