



REVISION TO THE SUSSEX COUNTY-WIDE WASTEWATER MANAGEMENT  
PLAN/SUSSEX COUNTY WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLANS

TAKE NOTICE that on **APR 29 2004**, pursuant to the provisions of the Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules, N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.5, a revision to the Sussex County-Wide Wastewater Management Plan/Sussex County Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department of Environmental Protection (Department).

This revision updates the above Plans to allow the transfer of 25,000 gallons per day (gpd) of assigned wastewater flow allocation within the Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority's Upper Wallkill plant from the Wallkill Valley High School to the Hardyston Township Municipal Utilities Authority (HTMUA) and reallocate the total gallonage, returning 17,000 gpd back to the Wallkill Valley High School (but now managed by the HTMUA), and providing the remaining 8,000 gpd to serve the projected needs of the proposed Sussex County YMCA Community Center. The proposed Sussex County YMCA is located within the approved sewer service area of Hardyston Township but did not have any wastewater flow allocation previously assigned. It has been determined that, based upon the April 15, 2003 Wallkill Valley Regional High School's Sewer Analysis Study performed by Guerin & Vreeland Engineering, Inc., inclusive of any future expansion plans for the Wallkill Valley High School, there exists an excess of 8,000 gpd of sewer flow allocation available for reallocation/transfer.

This revision has been reviewed in accordance with Executive Order No. 109 (2000) and N.J.A.C. 7:15-5.18. Due to the scope of this revision, it is not subject to the alternatives analysis under that Executive Order and rule provision.
