

QUARTERLY REPORT TO THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF BANKING & INSURANCE

No Fault Insurance PIP Arbitration 2nd Quarter, 2005



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Executive Summary

During the reporting period, an on-line DRP Evaluation process was added to the NAF web site. This feature permits system users to evaluate DRPs in specific cases by means of an on-line form. The form is accessible by visiting the web site or through an email alert sent to the parties or attorneys. The evaluation measures DRP proficiency in seven key areas. Individual comments may be included and characterized as positive, neutral or negative. The identities of the reviewers are not disclosed to the DRPs to ensure neutrality.

The Advisory Council was convened three times to qualify additional DRP candidates. A qualified DRP pool will enable NAF to respond quickly to changes in DRP staffing needs.

Significant enhancements to the NAF on-line Award Search web site are in the testing stages. The project is due for release into production in the third calendar quarter and will include easier full-text searching, unlimited search results and viewable NAF awards though June of 2005.

For the second calendar quarter, 9,033 cases were initiated in the PIP ADR program. Of these cases, 6,130 (68%) originated in the Northern region, 1,704 (19%) in the Central region, and 1,199 (13%) in the Southern region.

Of the pending cases filed with NAF in the PIP ADR program, 6,198 cases were concluded during the second quarter by means of an award or denial of award at hearing, dismissal of the case, settlement or withdrawal. 91 were placed in abeyance by consent of the parties or by order of the court.

During the second quarter, 1,177 cases settled during the 45-day conciliation period distributed regionally as follows: 797 in the North region, 225 in the Central region and 155 in the South region.

Of all cases resolved in the PIP ADR program during the quarter, a total of 4,878 cases were resolved after the DRP was appointed, from a combination of DRP issued awards, dismissals, settlements and withdrawals.

System-wide, the average total amount awarded in arbitration was \$3,560 comprised of \$2,400 for personal injury protection benefits and \$1,160 for attorney's fees.

Nine cases were appealed to 3-member DRP panels resulting in seven affirmances, one vacation and one modification.


First Managed Care Option was utilized as the Medical Review Organization in accordance with the DOBI directive. Parties requested 99 MRO reviews. Only one DRP request was made.

Cases Initiated

Cases are considered "filed" as of the date a Demand for Arbitration is received by NAF. Case "initiation" occurs when an initiation letter is transmitted to the parties.

In the second quarter of 2005, 9,033 cases were initiated in the PIP ADR program. Of these cases, 6,130 (68%) originated in the Northern region, 1,704 (19%) in the Central region, and 1,199 (13%) in the Southern region. See the Table below for the monthly distribution.

Disposition of Cases in the PIP ADR Program


Of the pending cases filed with NAF in the PIP ADR program, 6,198 cases were concluded during the second quarter by means of an award or denial of award at hearing, dismissal of the case, settlement or withdrawal. The table below illustrates the manner in which cases were administered and concluded in the various geographic regions.

Cases in Abeyance

Administration of certain cases is suspended by way of Court Order or consent of the parties. These cases are designated as in abeyance. Abeyances for the reporting period are shown in the table below by regional distribution and percentage.

Cases Settled within 45 Days of Initiation

Respondents are granted a conciliation period of 45 days from case initiation in which to settle claims without incurring a respondent administration fee. During the second quarter, 1,177 cases settled during the conciliation period distributed regionally as follows: 797 in the North region, 225 in the Central region and 155 in the South region.

The following table and chart illustrate that 7% to 8% of cases settle during the reconciliation period.

Dispute Resolution Professional Caseload

In the second quarter of 2005, there were 30 Dispute Resolution Professionals ("DRPs") arbitrating cases. Two DRPs were redeployed to better address regional volume. One North DRP moved to the South Region and another North DRP moved to the Central Region. Both of these individuals had requested redeployment when filings warranted it. During the reporting period, 6,896 cases were assigned to DRPs.

Caseload activity of DRPs is represented in Appendix A.

Disposition of Cases After DRP Assignment

Following expiration of the 45-day conciliation period, cases are assigned to DRPs for disposition. After DRP appointment, a total of 4,878 cases were resolved during the quarter, resulting from a combination of: DRP issued awards (which includes denials), dismissals, settlements and withdrawals.

The following table represents the distribution and outcomes of cases across the entire DRP panel during the second quarter of 2005 after the cases were assigned to the DRP for hearing:

Regional Awards' Percentage

As shown above, a total of 2,251 awards were issued by DRPs concerning requests for expedited relief, standard relief, fee disputes and appeals. 75% of the awards issued in the North region, 15% in the Central region and 10% in the South.



Awards as a Percentage of Claim Amount

Dispute Resolution Professions can deny a claim in its entirety or can award all or part of an amount requested by a Claimant. For cases decided in the second quarter of 2005, the graph below indicates the distribution of DRP awarded amounts, from 0% (denied) to more than 100%, of claim amounts. [Claims of more than 100% represent cases in which the initial claim was amended upward prior to or at the hearing in accordance with No-Fault Rule 7].



PIP Benefits and Attorneys' Fees Comparison

System-wide, the average total amount awarded in arbitration was \$3,560 comprised of \$2,400 for personal injury protection benefits and \$1,160 for attorney's fees. The graphical representation compares the data as percentages.



Award Average and Dollar Range

As displayed in the following table, the average amount awarded for claims other than attorneys' fees was \$2,400. Awarded amounts ranged from \$0 to \$98,879. The average amount awarded for attorneys' fees was \$1,160. Awarded attorneys' fees ranged from \$0 to \$7,250.
