

# QUARTERLY REPORT TO THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF BANKING & INSURANCE

No Fault Insurance PIP Arbitration 2nd Quarter, 2007



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### **Executive Summary**

The National Arbitration Forum ("FORUM") is diligent in its efforts to fulfill the needs of the NJ No-Fault stakeholders and to provide clear administrative guidance to its users. To that end, in the 1<sup>st</sup> calendar quarter, the FORUM filed a Petition for Review to the New Jersey Supreme Court seeking clarification of a decision of the Committee on the Unauthorized Practice of Law that impacts the application of No-Fault rules as approved by the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance. Although other stakeholders are more directly affected, the FORUM assumed the lead in seeking a review and interpretation of the decision. During this reporting period, the New Jersey Supreme Court granted certification and will hear the Petition.

Stakeholders' usage of the FORUM's free No-Fault web site increased again during the reporting period. Almost 600,000 page views were recorded during the quarter. This report includes a comparison of usage for the last four (4) calendar quarters.

The Advisory Council was convened in May and June to continue its review of No-Fault Arbitration Rules revisions. The council recessed for the summer and will re-convene in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter.

The DRP panel included 42 members. Regional DRP deployment consisted of 28 in the North Region, 8 in the Central Region and 6 in the South Region.

In the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2007, 10,127 cases were initiated in the PIP ADR program. Of these cases, 6,542 (65%) originated in the Northern region, 1,947 (19%) in the Central region, and 1,638 (16%) in the Southern region.

Of the pending cases filed with the Forum in the PIP ADR program, 9,249 cases were concluded during the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter by means of an award or denial of award (including appeals), pre-hearing dismissal of the case, settlement or withdrawal. 377 cases were placed in abeyance by consent of the parties or by order of the court. 8,195 cases were assigned to DRPs.

During the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter, 1,926 cases settled during the conciliation period distributed regionally as follows: 1,178 in the North region, 455 in the Central region and 293 in the South region.

System-wide, the average total amount awarded in arbitration was \$5,047 comprised of \$3,890 for personal injury protection benefits and \$1,157 for attorney's fees per case. It is common practice for users to stipulate that amounts awarded by DRPs are subject to further reduction for deductibles, co-payments, prior payments and/or medical fee schedule adjustments. In such cases, the final amount paid by the respondent for PIP benefits is less than the awarded amount.

Twenty-one (21) appeals to panels of 3 DRPs were concluded during the reporting period. Fifteen (14) involved awards rendered in the North Region, six (6) involved awards rendered in the Central Region, and 1 involved a South award. 29% of appeals resulted in some form of modification, vacation or remand.


During the reporting period, parties requested 106 MRO reviews. The requests were apportioned among the three current MROs on a random rotating basis. No DRP requests were made.

#### **Cases Initiated**

Cases are considered "filed" as of the date a Demand for Arbitration is received by the Forum. Case "initiation" occurs when an initiation letter is transmitted to the parties.

In the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2007, 10,127 cases were initiated in the PIP ADR program. Of these cases, 6,542 (65%) originated in the Northern region, 1,947 (19%) in the Central region, and 1,638 (16%) in the Southern region. See the Table below for the monthly distribution.

#### Disposition of Cases in the PIP ADR Program

Of the pending cases filed with the Forum in the PIP ADR program, 9,249 cases were concluded during the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter by means of an award or denial of award (including appeals), pre-hearing dismissal of the case, settlement or withdrawal. The table below illustrates the manner in which cases were administered and concluded in the various geographic regions.



#### **Cases in Abeyance**

Administration of certain cases is suspended by way of Court Order or consent of the parties. These cases are designated as in abeyance. Abeyances for the reporting period are shown in the table below by regional distribution and percentage.

#### Cases Settled within 45 Days of Initiation

Respondents are granted a conciliation period of 45 days from case initiation in which to settle claims without incurring a respondent administration fee. During the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter, 1,926 cases settled during the conciliation period distributed regionally as follows: 1,178 in the North region, 455 in the Central region and 293 in the South region.

The following table illustrates that 8% to 10% of cases settled during the reconciliation period.

\*Note: This data is based upon user communications describing cases as settled or resolved. There may be cases communicated as "withdrawn" which were settled and would qualify for this category.

#### **Dispute Resolution Professional Caseload**

For the quarter, the DRP panel consisted of 42 individuals regionally deployed as follows: North – 28; Central – 8; South – 6. During the reporting period, 8,195 cases were assigned to DRPs.

Caseload activity of DRPs is represented in Appendix A.

#### **Disposition of Cases after DRP Assignment**

Following expiration of the 45-day conciliation period, cases are assigned to DRPs for disposition. After DRP appointment, a total of 7,138 cases were resolved during the quarter, resulting from a combination of DRP issued awards (which includes denials and appeals), pre-hearing dismissals, settlements and withdrawals.

The following table represents the distribution and outcomes of cases across the entire DRP panel during the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2007 after the cases were assigned to the DRP for hearing:

#### **Regional Awards' Percentage**

As shown above, a total of 3,236 awards and consent awards were issued by DRPs concerning requests for expedited relief, standard relief, fee disputes and appeals. 65% of the awards issued in the North region, 21% in the Central region and 14% in the South.



#### Awards as a Percentage of Claim Amount

Dispute Resolution Professionals can deny a claim in its entirety or can award all or part of an amount requested by a Claimant. For cases decided in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2007, the graph below indicates the distribution of DRP awarded amounts, from 0% (denied/dismissed) to 100% of claimed amounts.

The data presentation for 2006 and thereafter was revised from previous years in that it no longer contains award data described as "more than 100%", representing claims amended upward at the time of hearing. This nomenclature was retained from reports provided to the Department by the prior administrator. However, the nomenclature is imprecise. DRPs may not award amounts greater than those claimed. For purposes of the data table and chart below, amended amounts are captured within a total amount claimed and then compared to the total amount awarded.



#### PIP Benefits and Attorneys' Fees Comparison

System-wide, the average total amount awarded in arbitration was \$5,047 comprised of \$3,890 for personal injury protection benefits and \$1,157 for attorney's fees per case. The graphical representation compares the data as percentages.



## Award Average, Median and Dollar Range

The average amount awarded for claims other than attorneys' fees was \$3,890.\* per case. Awarded amounts ranged from \$0 to \$244,319. The median award during the reporting period was \$1,295.

The average amount awarded for attorneys' fees was \$1,157 per case. Awarded attorneys' fees ranged from \$0 to \$17,500. The median attorney's fee award during the reporting period was \$1,185.

## Appeals

Twenty-one (21) appeals to panels of 3 DRPs were concluded during the reporting period. Fifteen (14) involved awards rendered in the North Region, six (6) involved awards rendered in the Central Region, and 1 involved a South award. 29% of appeals resulted in some form of modification, vacation or remand. The following table reports the results.

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#### Medical Review Organization Report


