Executive Summary

The National Arbitration Forum ("FORUM") is pleased to administer the New Jersey No-Fault personal injury protection ("PIP") dispute resolution program and encourages all PIP stakeholders to provide recommendations for future program improvements. The FORUM thanks the volunteers who serve on the No-Fault Advisory Council for their dedication and valuable advice.

Stakeholders' usage of the FORUM's free No-Fault website increased over the prior quarter. Over 730,000 page views were recorded during the quarter. This report includes a comparison of usage for the last four (4) calendar quarters.

For the quarter, the Dispute Resolution Professional ("DRP") panel was increased from 43 to 44. The DRPs were regionally deployed as follows: 28 in the North; 8 in the Central with full caseloads and 1 with a reduced caseload; and 7 in the South.

In the 1st quarter of 2008, 12,119 cases were initiated in the PIP ADR program. Of these cases, 8,253 (68%) originated in the Northern region, 2,448 (20%) in the Central region, and 1,418 (12%) in the Southern region.

Of the pending cases filed with the FORUM in the PIP ADR program, 10,610 cases were concluded during the 1st quarter by means of an award or denial of award (including appeals), prehearing dismissal of the case, settlement or withdrawal. 271 cases were placed in abeyance by consent of the parties or by order of the court. Exactly 8,550 cases were assigned to DRPs.

During the 1st quarter, 2,435 cases settled during the conciliation period distributed regionally as follows: 1,654 in the North region, 531 in the Central region and 250 in the South region.

System-wide, the average total amount awarded in arbitration was \$5,050 comprised of \$3,912 for personal injury protection benefits and \$1,138 for attorney's fees per case. It is common practice for users to stipulate that amounts awarded by DRPs are subject to further reduction for deductibles, co-payments, prior payments and/or medical fee schedule adjustments. In such cases, the final amount paid by the respondent for PIP benefits is less than the awarded amount.

Twenty-one (21) appeals to panels of 3 DRPs were concluded during the reporting period. Eleven (11) involved awards rendered in the North Region, five (5) involved awards rendered in the Central Region, and five (5) involved awards rendered in the South Region. Twenty-nine (29%) percent of appeals resulted in some form of modification, vacation or remand.


During the reporting period, parties requested 96 Medical Review Organization (MRO) reviews. The requests were apportioned among the three current MROs on a random rotating basis. No DRP requests were made.

Cases Initiated

Cases are considered "filed" as of the date a Demand for Arbitration is received by the FORUM. Case "initiation" occurs when an initiation letter is transmitted to the parties.

In the 1st quarter of 2008, 12,119 cases were initiated in the PIP ADR program. Of these cases, 8,253 (68%) originated in the Northern region, 2,448 (20%) in the Central region, and 1,418 (12%) in the Southern region. See the Table below for the monthly distribution.

Disposition of Cases in the PIP ADR Program


Of the pending cases filed with the FORUM in the PIP ADR program, 10,610 cases were concluded during the 1st quarter by means of an award or denial of award (including appeals), prehearing dismissal of the case, settlement or withdrawal. The table below illustrates the manner in which cases were administered and concluded in the various geographic regions.

Cases in Abeyance

Administration of certain cases is suspended by way of Court Order or consent of the parties. These cases are designated as in abeyance. Abeyances for the reporting period are shown in the table below by regional distribution and percentage.

Cases Settled Within 45 Days of Initiation

Respondents are granted a conciliation period of 45 days from case initiation in which to settle claims without incurring a respondent administration fee. During the 1st quarter, 2,435 cases settled during the conciliation period distributed regionally as follows: 1,654 in the North region, 531 in the Central region and 250 in the South region.

The following table illustrates that 8% to 11% of cases settled during the reconciliation period.

*Note: This data is based upon user communications describing cases as settled or resolved. There may be cases communicated as "withdrawn" which were settled and would qualify for this category.

Dispute Resolution Professional Caseload

For the quarter, the DRP panel was increased from 43 to 44. The DRPs were regionally deployed as follows: 28 in the North; 8 in the Central with full caseloads and 1 with a reduced caseload; 7 in the South.

Caseload activity of DRPs is represented in Appendix A.

Disposition of Cases After DRP Assignment

Following expiration of the 45-day conciliation period, cases are assigned to DRPs for disposition. After DRP appointment, a total of 7,915 cases were resolved during the quarter, resulting from a combination of DRP issued awards (which includes denials and appeals), pre-hearing dismissals, settlements and withdrawals.

The following table represents the distribution and outcomes of cases across the entire DRP panel during the 1st quarter of 2008 after the cases were assigned to the DRP for hearing:

Regional Awards' Percentage

As shown above, a total of 2,860 awards were issued by DRPs concerning requests for expedited relief, standard relief, fee disputes and appeals. 65% of the awards issued in the North region, 20% in the Central region and 15% in the South.



Awards as a Percentage of Claim Amount

Dispute Resolution Professionals can deny a claim in its entirety or can award all or part of an amount requested by a Claimant. For cases decided in the 1st quarter of 2008, the graph below indicates the distribution of DRP awarded amounts, from 0% (denied/dismissed) to 100% of claimed amounts.

The data presentation for 2006 and thereafter was revised from previous years in that it no longer contains award data described as "more than 100%", representing claims amended upward at the time of hearing. This nomenclature was retained from reports provided to the Department by the prior administrator. However, the nomenclature is imprecise. DRPs may not award amounts greater than those claimed. For purposes of the data table and chart below, amended amounts are captured within a total amount claimed and then compared to the total amount awarded.



PIP Benefits and Attorney's Fees Comparison

System-wide, the average total amount awarded in arbitration was \$5,050 comprised of \$3,912 for personal injury protection benefits and \$1,138 for attorney's fees per case. The graphical representation compares the data as percentages.



Award Average, Median and Dollar Range

The average amount awarded for claims other than attorney's fees was \$3,912.* per case. Awarded amounts ranged from \$0 to \$283,991. The median award during the reporting period was \$1,145.

The average amount awarded for attorney's fees was \$1,138 per case. Awarded attorney's fees ranged from \$0 to \$9,500. The median attorney's fees award during the reporting period was \$1,200.

*NOTE: It is common practice for users to stipulate that amounts awarded by DRPs are subject to further reduction for policy deductibles, co-payments, prior payments and/or medical fee schedule adjustments. In such cases, the final amount paid by the respondent for PIP benefits is less than the awarded amount.

Appeals

Twenty-one (21) appeals to panels of 3 DRPs were concluded during the reporting period. Eleven (11) involved awards rendered in the North Region, five (5) involved awards rendered in the Central Region, and five (5) involved awards rendered in the South Region. Twenty-nine (29%) percent of appeals resulted in some form of modification, vacation or remand. The following table reports the results.


Medical Review Organization Report
