Executive Summary

In the 1st quarter of 2011, 15,538 cases were initiated in the PIP ADR program. Of these cases, 10,941 (70%) originated in the Northern region 2,089 (14%) in the Central region, and 2,508 (16%) in the Southern region.

Of the pending cases filed with the FORUM in the PIP arbitration program, 13,805 cases were concluded during the 1st quarter by means of an award or denial of award (including appeals), pre-hearing dismissal of the case, settlement or withdrawal. There were 204 cases placed in abeyance by consent of the parties or by order of the court. There were 11,977 cases assigned to DRPs.

During the 4th quarter, 3,277 cases settled during the conciliation period distributed regionally as follows: 2,274 in the North region; 498 in the Central region; 505 in the South region. There are likely cases that the parties communicated as "withdrawn" or otherwise concluded which were actually settled and would qualify for this category.

System-wide, the average amount awarded in arbitration (excluding filing fees) was \$5,175 comprised of \$4,091 for personal injury protection benefits and \$1,084 for attorney's fees per case. It is common practice for users to stipulate that amounts awarded by DRPs are subject to further reduction for deductibles, co-payments, prior payments, and/or medical fee schedule adjustments. In such cases, the final amount paid by the respondent for PIP benefits is less than the awarded amount.

Twenty-three appeals to panels of 3 DRPs were concluded during the reporting period. Eighteen (18) involved awards rendered in the North Region, four (4) in the Central Region and one (1 in the South Region. Thirty (30%) percent of appeals resulted in some form of modification, vacation, or remand.

During the reporting period, parties requested 155 Medical Review Organization (MRO) reviews. DRPs did not request any reviews. The requests were apportioned among the three current MROs on a random rotating basis.


The Panel of Dispute Resolution Professionals (DRPs) consisted of 48 members. The DRPs were regionally deployed as follows: 32 in the North; 8 in the Central with full caseloads and 1 with a reduced caseload; 7 in the South.

Cases Initiated

Cases are considered "filed" as of the date a Demand for Arbitration is received by the FORUM. Case "initiation" occurs when an initiation letter is transmitted to the parties.

In the 1st quarter of 2011, 15,538 cases were initiated in the PIP ADR program. Of these cases, 10,941 (70%) originated in the Northern region 2,089 (14%) in the Central region, and 2,508 (16%) in the Southern region. See the table below for the monthly distribution.

Disposition of Cases in the PIP ADR Program


Of the pending cases filed with the FORUM in the PIP arbitration program, 13,805 cases were concluded during the 1st quarter by means of an award or denial of award (including appeals), pre-hearing dismissal of the case, settlement or withdrawal. The table below illustrates the manner in which cases were administered and concluded in the various geographic regions.

Cases in Abeyance

Administration of certain cases is suspended by way of Court Order or consent of the parties. These cases are designated as in abeyance. Abeyances for the reporting period are shown in the table below by regional distribution and percentage.

Cases Settled within 45 Days of Initiation

The respondents are granted a conciliation period of 45 days from case initiation in which to settle claims without incurring the respondent administration fee. During the 1st quarter, 2,997 cases settled during the conciliation period distributed regionally as follows: 2,100 in the North region; 424 in the Central region; 473 in the South region.

The following table expresses the regional distribution in numbers and percentages.

*Note: This data is based only upon user communications describing cases as settled or resolved. There are likely cases that the parties communicated as "withdrawn" or otherwise concluded which were actually settled and would qualify for this category.

Dispute Resolution Professional Caseload

For the quarter, the DRP panel consisted of 48 members. The DRPs were regionally deployed as follows: 32 in the North; 8 in the Central with full caseloads and 1 with a reduced caseload; 7 in the South.

Caseload activity of DRPs is represented in Appendix A.

Disposition of Cases after DRP Assignment

Following expiration of the 45-day conciliation period, cases are assigned to DRPs for disposition. After DRP appointment, a total of 10,506 cases were resolved during the quarter, resulting from a combination of DRP issued awards (which includes denials and appeals), pre-hearing dismissals, settlements, and withdrawals.

The following table represents the distribution and outcomes of cases across the entire DRP panel, during the 1st quarter of 2011, after the cases were assigned to the DRP for hearing.

Regional Awards' Percentage

As shown above, a total of 3,360 awards were issued by DRPs concerning requests for expedited relief, standard relief, fee disputes, and appeals. Of the awards issued, 68% were in the North region, 15% in the Central region, and 17% in the South.

Awards as a Percentage of Claim Amount


DRPs can deny a claim in its entirety or can award all or part of an amount requested by a Claimant. For cases decided in the 1st quarter of 2011, the graph below indicates the distribution

of DRP total awarded amounts, from 0% (denied/dismissed) to 100% of claimed amounts. Total awarded amounts include PIP benefits, legal fees and costs.

*Note: The data presentation for 2006 and thereafter was revised from previous years in that it no longer contains award data described as "more than 100%," representing claims amended upward at the time of hearing. This nomenclature was retained from reports provided to the Department by the prior administrator. However, the nomenclature is imprecise. DRPs may not award amounts greater than those claimed.

For purposes of the data table and chart below, amended amounts are captured within a total amount claimed and then compared to the total amount awarded.



PIP Benefits and Attorney's Fees Comparison

System-wide, the average amount awarded in arbitration (excluding filing fees) was \$5,175 comprised of \$4,091 for personal injury protection benefits and \$1,084 for attorney's fees per case. The graphical representation compares the data as percentages.



Award Average, Median and Dollar Range

The average amount awarded for claims other than attorney's fees and costs was \$4,091* per case. Awarded amounts ranged from \$0 to \$241,167. The median award during the reporting period was \$1,085.

The average amount awarded for attorney's fees was \$1,084 per case. Awarded attorney's fees ranged from \$0 to \$5,100. The median attorney's fee award during the reporting period was \$1,100.

Appeals


Medical Review Organization Report
