Your local wetland types include: <u>tidal freshwater marsh</u> (this type can be seen, e.g., from the Watson Woods picnic area of Roebling Park); <u>ponds</u> (Spring Lake at Roebling Park; Northern Community Park); <u>marsh / swamp</u> (parts of Roebling Park, Northern Community Park); and <u>tidal rivers</u> (e.g., Crosswicks Creek from the Bordentown Bluffs; Delaware River from the Bordentown Beach or I-295 scenic overlook; Duck Creek from the D&R Canal Tow Path Trail).
