Age appropriate for students in grades 3-8

Bullying happens because bystanders don't intervene. Have your students join in conversation with the high school age daughters of NJ Representative Rob Andrews who are telling of their personal experiences with bullies; the curriculum that they wrote to help students stand up to bullies; and the screenplay and songs that they have written to address this growing problem.

**Commemorate Kristallnacht (The Night of  
Broken Glass) with**

Age appropriate for students in grades 6-12

In Nazi Germany, the night of Nov. 9, 1938 was a night of violence against Jews and of destruction of the businesses and other property belonging to them. The name is a reference to the broken glass that resulted from the destruction. Have your students hear about these events from 2 eyewitnesses to this historic night and join in conversation with students from 4 other schools as they question these Holocaust survivors.

Friday, December 18, 2009:

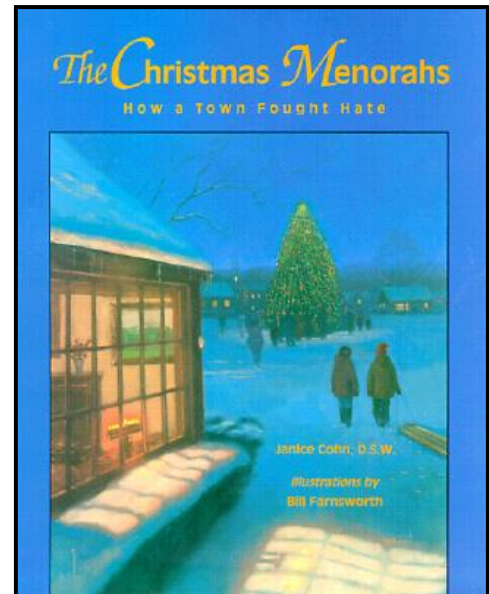
**Read Aloud: “The Christmas Menorahs: The

The book tells what happened when the town was being terrorized by hate crimes against minorities and how the community took action. Our staff members will engage the students’ questions about bullying and speaking up when they see something wrong going on around them.

Have your students join in a conversation with these eyewitnesses to history and get the insight of those whose lives have been changed forever because of the Holocaust, as well as students from 4 other schools.

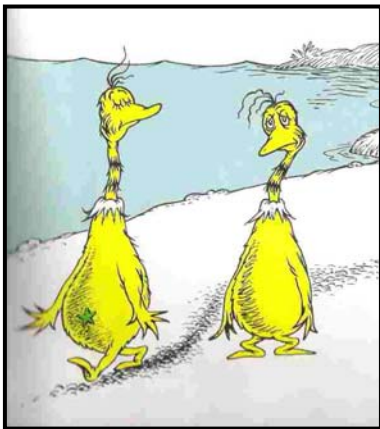
Wednesday, February 24, 2010:

Wednesday, April 14, 2010:

### Commemorate Yom Hashoah (Holocaust Memorial Day) with The Goodwin Holocaust Museum and Education Center

10am-11am

Age appropriate for students in grades 6-12

Have your students join in conversation with Holocaust survivors and students from 4 other schools. The focus of this videoconference will be Righteous Rescuers and the lives that they saved, as told by Holocaust survivors whose lives were saved because of the bravery of honorable "Upstanders."



Monday, April 26, 2010:

### Defiance-Starring Daniel Craig

10am-11am

This movie is the incredible but true story of the Bielski brothers, who against all odds during World War II, survived in the forest and saved almost 1200 Jewish lives.

The movie, which is Rated R, deals with the history as well as the ethical decisions faced by these partisans. Have your students join in the conversation as we discuss these issues with a Holocaust survivor who lived in the woods with the Bielski group, as well as the Executive Director of the Jewish Partisans Educational Foundation, who consulted with Paramount on the making of the film.

All students are required to watch the movie, *Defiance* before participating in this videoconference. (The video, which is approximately 2 hours long and a teacher's guide will be provided upon registration.)



Tuesday, May 4, 2010:

### Genocide in Today's World

10am-11am

Meet Dr. Jerry Ehrlich, who volunteered as a physician for "Doctors Without Borders" in Darfur, and discuss issues about Darfur and Genocide today.

All students are required to watch the movie, *The Devil Came on Horseback*, before participating in this videoconference. (The video, which is approximately 80 minutes long and teacher's guide will be provided upon registration.)

Many of the scenes in the movie are graphic, so we recommend this program for students in grades 9-12 only.

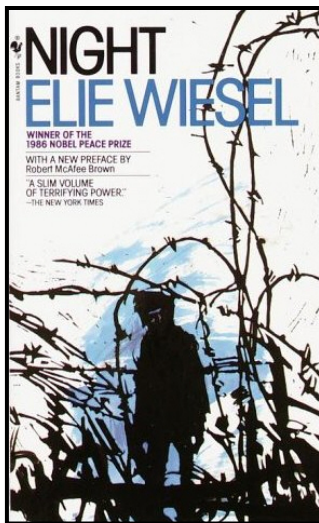
Monday, May 10, 2010:

Tuesday, May 25, 2010:

**Book Talk on *Night* written by Elie Wiesel**

10am-11am

Age appropriate for students in grades 8-12

*Night* by Elie Wiesel focuses on the final year of the Holocaust in Auschwitz, the Nazi death camp. Students will be given the opportunity to discuss and explore different aspects of the Holocaust, suffering and human rights through a series of thought-provoking questions, actual interviews with Elie Wiesel, and photographs. This will be facilitated by a leader in Holocaust education. (Upon registration, a variety of materials will be provided for historical context, suggested teaching strategies, and to stimulate classroom discussion.)

All students are required to have completed the reading of the novel, *Night*, in order to participate in this program

Tuesday, June 1, 2010:

**Virtual Tour of the Goodwin Holocaust Museum**

Age appropriate for students in grades 6-12

Join us for a virtual tour, as trained docents take you through our Goodwin Holocaust Museum, the only Holocaust Museum in the state of New Jersey, explaining the different artifacts and exhibits that we have and answering student questions.
