The record of this matter and the decision of the School Ethics Commission (Commission) have been reviewed. Comments with respect to the Commission's recommended penalty were timely submitted by respondent, and were duly considered by the Commissioner in rendering the decision herein.<sup>1</sup>

Initially, it must be emphasized that pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 18A:12-29(c), the determination of the Commission as to violation of the Act is *not reviewable* by the Commissioner, and that only the School Ethics Commission may determine whether a violation of the School Ethics Act has occurred. The Commissioner's jurisdiction is limited to reviewing the sanction to be imposed following a finding of a violation by the School Ethics Commission. Therefore, this decision is restricted solely to a review of the recommended penalty and its implementation.

Upon thorough review of the record in this matter, the Commissioner determines to accept the Commission's recommendation that censure is the appropriate penalty for the reasons expressed in the Commission's decision.
