SYNOPSIS

Petitioning Board averred that respondent was in conflict of interest pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 18A:12-2. The Board sought removal of respondent as a Board member.

Because respondent had a tort claim against the school district on behalf of her two minor children, the ALJ declared respondent in conflict of interest.

The Commissioner concurred that, for the reasons set forth in the Initial Decision, respondent was not eligible to be a member of the petitioning Board.
