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SYNOPSIS

The New Jersey State Department of Corrections filed tenure charges of conduct unbecoming a public employee against respondent, a tenured teacher, and sought to terminate his employment at the Albert C. Wagner Youth Correctional Facility. Neither respondent nor any attorney acting on his behalf filed an answer to the petition following notice pursuant to *N.J.A.C.* 6A:3-5.3 and 6A:3-5.4.

The Commissioner concluded that the allegations – which respondent has chosen not to deny – may be deemed admitted and are sufficient to warrant termination of the respondent from his tenured position. Accordingly, the Commissioner granted summary decision to the petitioner, dismissed the respondent from his tenured position with the Department, and forwarded a copy of this decision to the State Board of Examiners for action against respondent's certificate as that body deems appropriate.

This matter was opened before the Commissioner of Education on February 4, 2011 through the certification of tenure charges of conduct unbecoming a public employee by the New Jersey State Department of Corrections (hereinafter "Department") against Salvatore Piccoli, a tenured teacher assigned to the Albert C. Wagner Youth Correctional

Facility. The Commission seeks Mr. Piccoli's dismissal from his position.

By notice dated February 4, 2011, the Commissioner directed respondent, via both certified and regular mail – the certified green card, signifying delivery, having been returned to the Department on February 9, 2011– to file an Answer to the tenure charges against him. This communication clearly provided notice to respondent that, pursuant to *N.J.A.C.* 6A:3-5.3 and 6A:3-5.4, an individual against whom tenure charges are certified "shall have 15 days from the day such charges are filed with the Commissioner to file a written response to the charges with the Commissioner," and that failure to answer within the prescribed period would,

absent granting of an extension for good cause shown, result in the charges being deemed admitted by the charged employee. Because no reply has been received from respondent, or any attorney on his behalf, in response to the Department's charges, each count of the charges against respondent is deemed to be admitted.

The Commissioner has reviewed the tenure charges certified against respondent by the Department and the statement of evidence in support of those charges, which specify:

CHARGE(s)

N.J.A.C. 4A:2-2-3(a)11. Other Sufficient Cause; A6 Conduct unbecoming a public employee; HRB 84-17, as amended: D6a – Loss or careless control of keys, pagers/beepers or cellular telephones; C17 – Possession of contraband on State property; E1 Violation of a rule, regulation, policy, procedure, order or administrative decision; C:11 Conduct unbecoming an employee.

SPECIFICATION(s)

By your own admission and the findings of an SID investigation, it has been determined that on 12/10/10 you introduced your personal cell phone into the lobby of A.C. Wagner YCF and purposely left the unauthorized item unattended in an area frequented by inmates while you entered the institution to finish your workday in violation of PSM.001.017.

Deeming such charge to be admitted, and noting that respondent has failed to respond to the allegations against him, the Commissioner finds that the Department has demonstrated that respondent is guilty of conduct unbecoming and other just cause warranting the Department's requested penalty of respondent's termination from his position.

Accordingly, summary decision is hereby granted to the Department, and respondent Salvatore Piccoli is hereby terminated from his position with the New Jersey Department of Corrections, Albert C. Wagner Youth Correctional Facility effective with the

filing date of this decision.¹ A copy of this decision shall be forwarded to the State Board of Examiners for action against respondent's certificate(s) as it deems appropriate.
