SYNOPSIS

The School Ethics Commission (Commission) found that respondent – a member of the Asbury Park Board of Education – violated *N.J.S.A.* 18A:12-24(c) of the School Ethics Act when he voted to reappoint his mother, a teacher in the District, and her supervisor. The Commission recommended the penalty of reprimand in this matter.

Upon review, the Commissioner – whose jurisdiction is limited to reviewing the Commission's recommended sanction – concurred that reprimand is the appropriate penalty for the violations found. Accordingly, the Commissioner directed that respondent be reprimanded as a school officer found to have violated the School Ethics Act.

This matter comes before the Commissioner to impose a sanction upon Respondent Joseph

Raines, member of the Asbury Park Board of Education, based upon findings of fact and conclusions of law

by the Commission that he violated N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24 (c) of the Code of Ethics for School Board Members.

The record and the decision of the School Ethics Commission (Commission), including the recommended

penalty of reprimand, have been reviewed.

Initially, it must be emphasized that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:12-29(c) and N.J.A.C. 6A:3-

9.1, the determination of the Commission as to violation of the School Ethics Act is not reviewable by the

Commissioner unless a notice of appeal is filed pursuant to P.L. 2008, c. 36 and N.J.A.C. 6A:4. Because

respondent did not file such an appeal, this decision is restricted solely to a review of the Commission's

recommended penalty.

Second, respondent filed no exceptions to the recommended penalty of reprimand, which is

the minimum available sanction. Nor does the Commissioner find any cause to reject the Commission's

recommendation.

Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Joseph Raines be reprimanded as a school

official found to have violated the School Ethics Act.1
