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WORKSHOP DESCRIPTIONS

Session 1: 10:20am-11:15am

A. Title: What It Means to be an Environmental Hero: Barnegat Bay Mosaic Mural Project

Description: This workshop will identify the key steps in establishing collaborations that enhance afterschool projects and discuss strategies used to obtain partners, collaborators, the community and entire family involved in the afterschool program. The concept of interrelations, the interconnectedness of all parts of the Estuary watershed and the world's water will be discussed.

B. Title: Soar into Writing a Children's Book

Description: This workshop will help participants to create a positive and innovative atmosphere for all ages, levels and learning styles. Participants will be exposed to and learn the elements of literature and identify the various genres. Participants will apply the writing process, create a story, and illustrate the book.

C. Title: Building Skills and Character through Sportsmanship

Description: Through this workshop, participants will learn how to partner and network with non-profit organizations to provide meaningful experiences for students. This workshop will discuss how sports activities stress core character values and positively influence student learning.

Session 2: 11:20am-12:15pm

D. Title: High School and College Partnerships

Description: Participants will learn how this partnership provides students with access to dual credit courses and other college programs. This workshop will identify issues and barriers to college, while understanding the benefits of giving high school students a head start at college.

E. Title: Promoting Cooperative Learning Activities

Description: Participants will be able to better utilize community resources in providing hands-on learning for their afterschool program, as well as understand the importance of developing meaningful, sustainable, collaborative partnerships. This workshop will highlight the importance of how these partnerships engage children in outdoor education activities.

F. Title: All About Me

Description: This workshop will demonstrate how to integrate skills across the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards, while encouraging family involvement. Learn how to help students enhance their vocabulary, explore their imaginations, and engage them in learning about their culture and personal heritage.

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Session 3: 1:30pm-2:15pm

G. Title: Enhancing Environmental Stewardship through Partnerships

Description: This workshop will discuss ways to establish partnerships and help participants gain the knowledge and awareness of environmental issues within their communities. Strategies will be discussed to empower students to make a difference and become future community leaders and environmental protectors. The workshop participants will have an opportunity to gather the resources and information necessary to replicate the Youth Environmental Action (YEA) Program.

H. Title: Healthy Cooking and Exercise for Fun

Description: Through this workshop, participants will learn how Pemberton's healthy cooking and ultimate sports clubs were designed to provide students with new skills and awareness of how healthy foods and eating combined with exercise contribute to a healthier life style.

I. Title: Digital Storytelling: What is a Hero?

Description: Through this workshop, participants will learn how to actively engage students in learning about strong character traits and how they relate to historical figures, through digital technology. Participants will understand how to assist students in creating a storyboard, which will provide the basis for digital storytelling.
