Workshop Descriptions

The Future of NJIIS: Enhanced Connections for People, Providers, & Public Health Bhavani Sathya, MPH - The New Jersey Immunization Information System (NJIIS) is currently undergoing a complete rewrite! The new NJIIS (scheduled to be launched in 2017) will have an updated look and feel, as well as enhanced functionality to various modules. This interactive presentation will provide an overview of the registry's current capabilities, give attendees the chance to provide inputs on functionality for the new NJIIS, and to view a preview and **vote** on some of the new screens and functionality.

Disease Investigation: Best Practices – Jill Dinitz-Sklar, MPH - This presentation will provide information regarding best practices for the investigation and surveillance of vaccine preventable diseases. Specifically, this discussion will emphasize collaborative efforts between public health partners in order to conduct complete investigations of these diseases.

Understanding VFC & 317 Eligibility - Nancy Rosenthal, MS - This session will comprise of an in-depth discussion about eligibility criteria for the VFC & 317 Programs as well as cover best practices for screening for & documenting patient eligibility.

Preventing Fraud & Waste: Use, Don't Abuse – Christopher Ryan, MICP, CPM - This session will provide participants with a better understanding of what constitutes fraud and abuse as it relates to the Vaccines for Children Program. Topic areas that will be covered include CDC definition of fraud and abuse, common examples of fraud and abuse, VFC investigation and referral process, ways to report suspected cases of fraud and abuse, and preventative measures to avoid fraud & waste.

From Your EHR to NJIIS: Best Practices for Using your Interface to Improve Data Quality and Vaccine Inventory Management- Justine Legbedze, MPH and Patricia Kaiser - The purpose of the workshop is to offer a general overview of the Interface Management System in NJIIS. The workshop will review best practices for utilizing your interface to improve data reporting, manage vaccine inventory, and enhance data quality in the Registry.

Disease Detection & Response: Varicella – Noelle Bessette, MPH - This presentation will highlight best practices and collaborative approaches for conducting varicella case and outbreak surveillance, investigation, and response. Participants will gain an understanding of the disease, reporting and vaccination requirements, and methods for case and outbreak investigations.

Be the Resource: Engaging Patients, Providers, and Communities – Jennifer Smith, MPH, CHES - This presentation will provide an overview of the New Jersey Department of Health Vaccine Preventable Disease Program's health education materials. Participants will be able to identify various immunization educational resources in order to raise awareness about vaccine-preventable diseases, understand NJ's school immunization requirements, and communicate key messages to promote age-appropriate vaccination.

13. Apply vaccine educational resources to promote timely vaccination across the life-span.
14. Discuss best practices for the investigation and surveillance of vaccine preventable diseases.
