- Gonorrhea

- Syphilis, all stages and congenital

Occupational and Environmental Diseases, Injuries, and Poisonings 609-826-4920 Report within 30 days after

diagnosis or treatment

- Work-related asthma (possible, probable, and confirmed)
- Silicosis
- Asbestosis
- Pneumoconiosis, other and unspecified

Occupational and Environmental Diseases, Injuries, and Poisonings *(continued)*

- Extrinsic allergic alveolitis
- Lead, mercury, cadmium, arsenic toxicity in adults
- Work-related injury in children (< age 18)
- · Work-related fatal injury
- Occupational dermatitis
- Poisoning caused by known or suspected occupational exposure
- Pesticide toxicity
- Work-related carpal tunnel syndrome
- Other occupational disease
