The changing face of CCC became more evident day by day as the college progressed with its ambitious \$18 million construction program.

The \$6 million Shirlee and Bernard Brown University Center is taking shape adjacent to the Frank Guaradani Arts Center. The 15,000 square-foot university center is scheduled to open in December 2008, but in the meantime, University Partnerships are thriving at Cumberland. Students are earning bachelor's and master's degrees at CCC through University Partnerships.

This summer, two large parking lots were built on the north side of campus, and paths and roadways were laid out along College Drive and throughout the campus.

A new college entrance was deared and paved on College Drive, and it leads to the college's new "front door," which is a circle in front of the student center.

There's another new entrance closer to Sherman Avenue for students who are attending classes in buildings on the northern side of the campus.

Other construction projects included library renovations, studios to the Guaradani Arts Center and turning the Wheaton Building into the Frank Wheaton Allied Health Center, which open this January.
