## College of Saint Elizabeth Offering Program for Educators to Develop Students' Social-Emotional Skills, Manage Emotions, Develop Caring and Concern for Others, and Make Responsible Decisions

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In late July, 2014, the project team that is developing a nationwide online credentialing program for school leaders who wish to successfully implement social-emotional learning and character development programs in their schools met at the College of Saint Elizabeth (CSE) in Morristown, N.J. The goal for the day was to orient the team to the online systems, tools, and resources that will be used to deliver the course work and the virtual professional learning community for the program. The program, a joint effort by College of Saint Elizabeth and Rutgers University, will be phased in over the next three years and then will become an ongoing part of the continuing professional education offerings at the College of Saint Elizabeth. The current phase is funded by a grant from the NoVo Foundation.

Attending the planning day were: project co-leaders, Dr. Patricia Heindel of CSE and Dr. Maurice Elias of Rutgers University; workshop co-facilitators, Joe Cervantes of Bridgetheory (online teaching/learning expert) and Adrian Uribarri of Bask Lang (marketing and communication consultant); members of the CSE Academic Computing and Media Services staff, some members of our expert team of curriculum developers, and Melanie Conti, the co-director of the CSE School Culture and Climate Assessment Lab.

This nationwide program will provide online credential training for educators. It will provide participants with knowledge of the latest innovations in developing students' social-emotional skills school-wide to help them recognize and manage emotions, develop caring and concern for others, establish positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. This will then help create safe, nurturing school culture and climates that encourages academic success and emotional well-being for elementary, middle, and high school students.
