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Burlington County College to Participate in Statewide Community College Completion Challenge, Oct. 14-18

Pemberton, NJ—Burlington County College (BCC) will host a series of campus-based activities for the first-ever New Jersey Community College Completion Challenge (NJ C4) week from Monday, Oct. 14 to Friday, Oct. 18.

Sponsored by the New Jersey Council of County Colleges' (NJCCC) Center for Student Success and the New Jersey Education Association (NJEA), the NJ C4 initiative is an effort to increase the number of community college students completing their associate degrees or certificates before transferring to a four-year college or entering the workforce.
