

What does it mean to be classified as SCNC?

- Clearinghouse Parameters
 - No valid (i.e. Full or Part-Time) Enrollment Record 18 months prior to the study period
 - January 1st 2020 through July 31st 2021
 - Did not earn a credential prior to July 31st 2021
 - Undergraduate student only

SCNC Population and Net Growth







SCNC Population Group by Age at Last Enrollment




Age at Last Enrollment




SCNC Student Success: Re-Enrollment

Academic Year 2021/22

1. Re-Enrollment -

Over **864,800** (or 2.1% of the 40 million) SCNC students re-enrolled in postsecondary education.



Down **8.4%** from AY 2020/21 (944,200)



2. First Credential -

53,300 students earned a credential (or 0.1% of the 40 million SCNC students) within a single year of re-enrolling.



Down 11.6% from AY 2020/21 (60,500)



Academic Year 2021/22

3. Perseverance -

Of the 944,200 SCNC students who re-enrolled in 2020/21, **508,700** students persevered in the following year (53.9%).



Down 4.6% from AY 2020/21 (531,700)

Two years after re-enrolling:

15.4 percent or **145,900** of the 944,200 re-enrollees in AY 2020/21 earned their first ever credential: 6.4 percent (60,500) earned in their first year of re-enrollment and 9.0 percent (85,400) in their second year of re-enrollment


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Re-Enrollment Rates by SCNC Student Group

Academic Year 2021/22


Re-Enrollment Rate






Success and Progress by Race/Ethnicity






Type of First Credential Earned Within a Year of Re-Enrollment by SCNC Student Group and Race/Ethnicity
