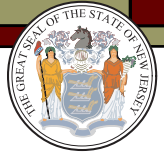

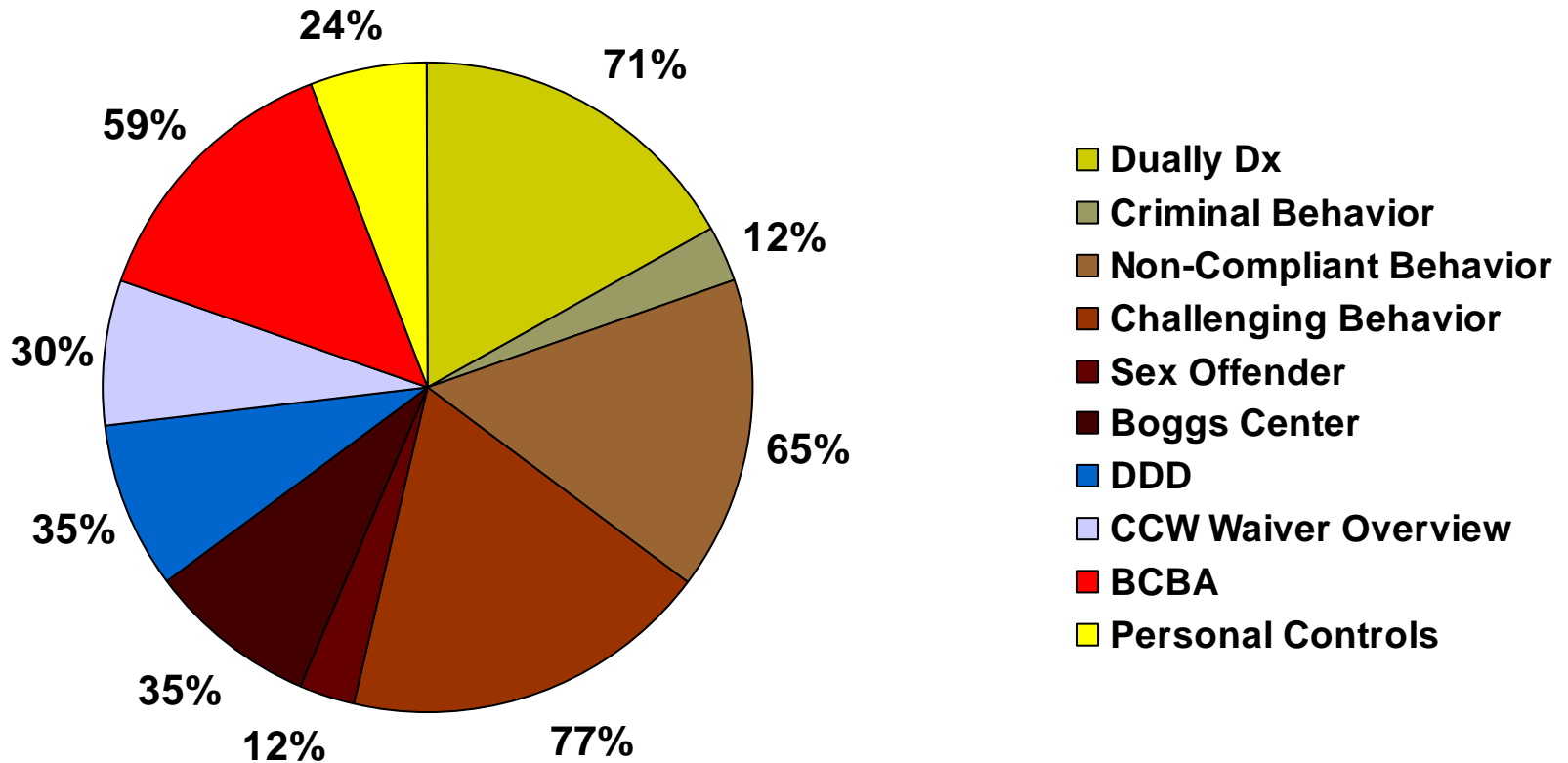


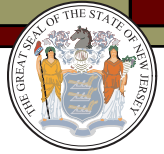
Do you feel your staff need more training?



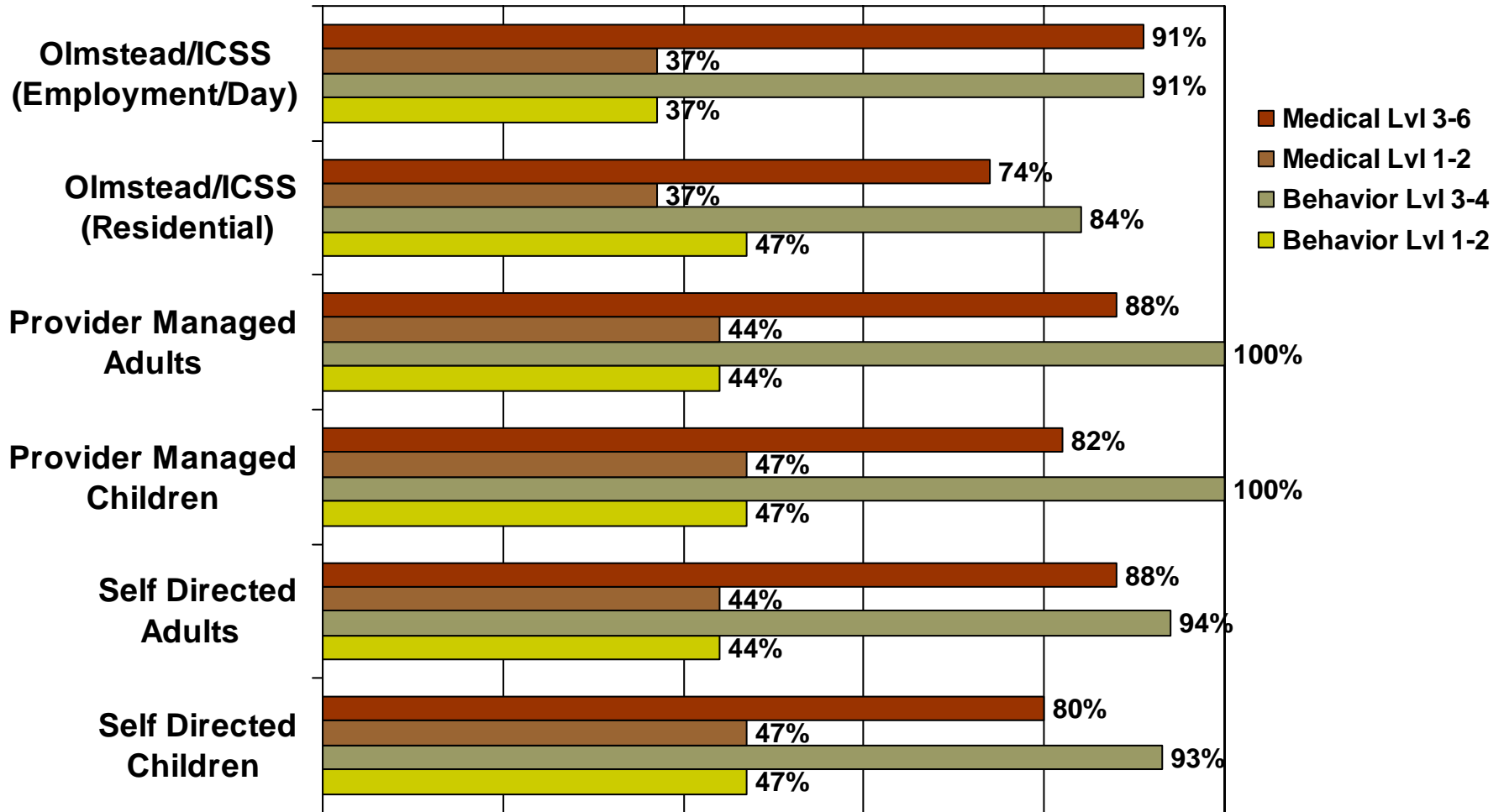


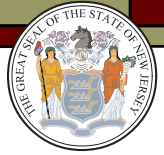

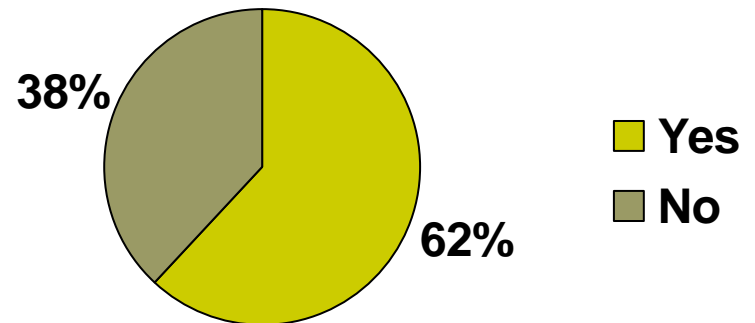
Is your agency participating in the CPEP "In-Home" Program?

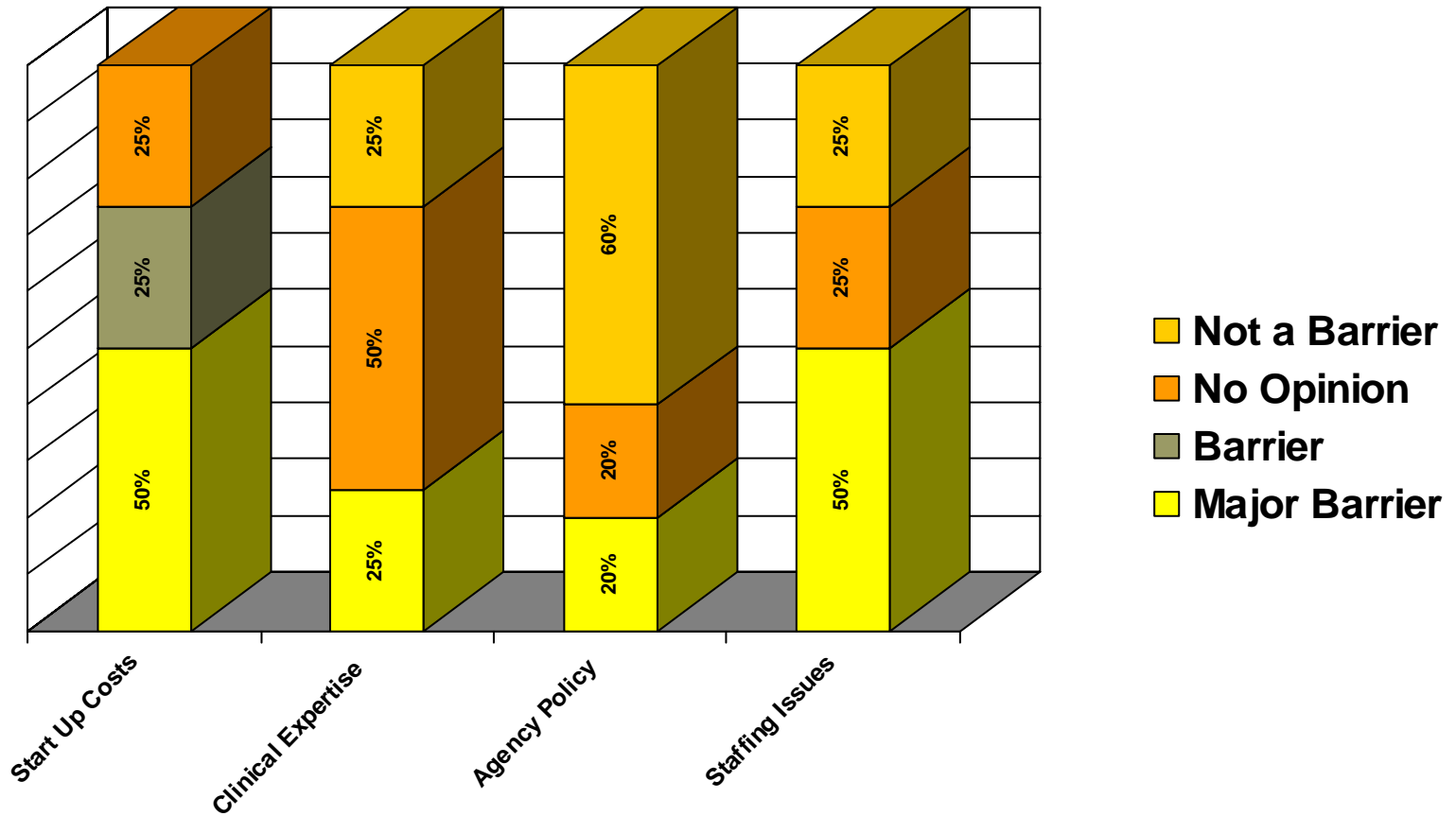
Is your agency planning to participate in the CPEP "In-Home" Program?

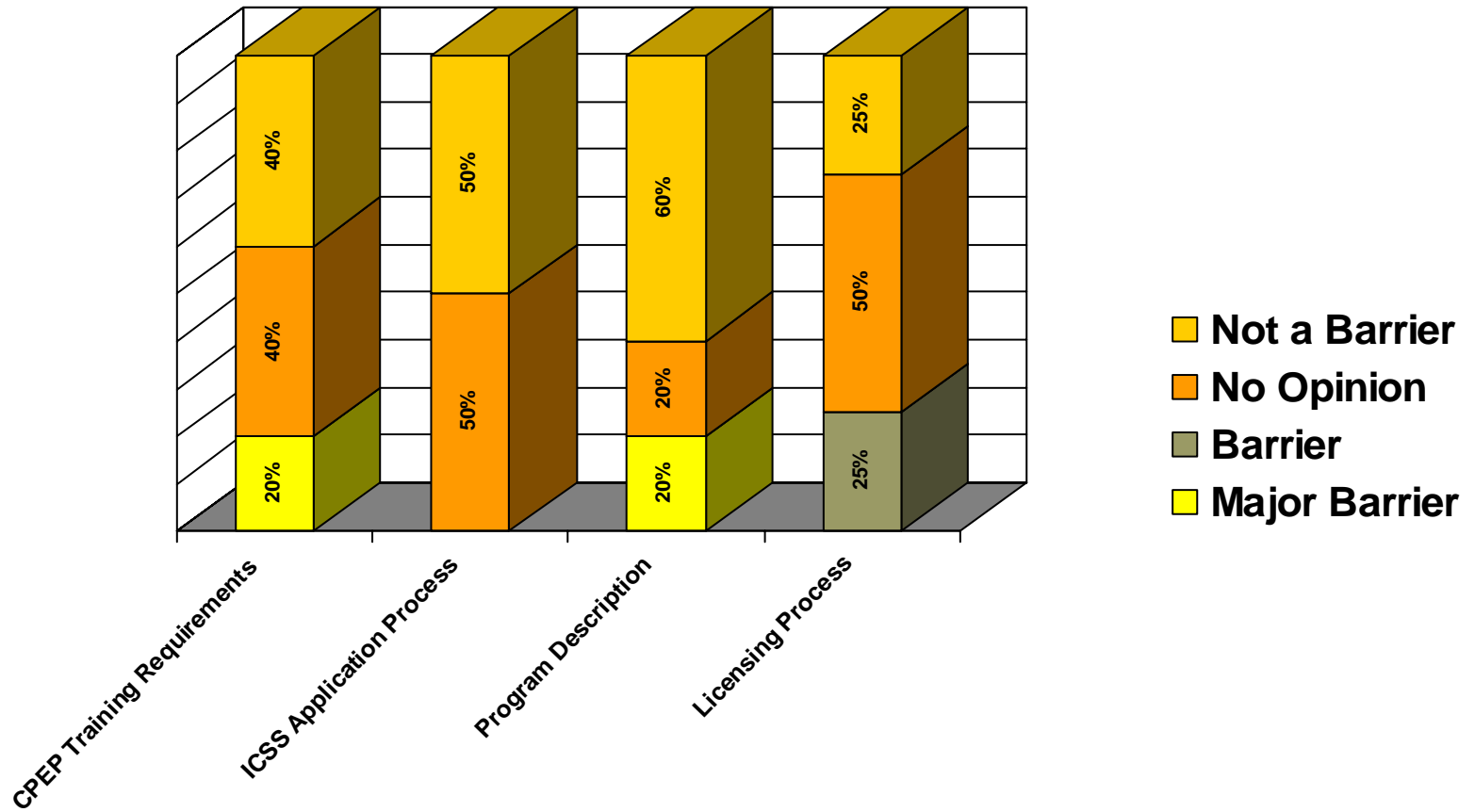

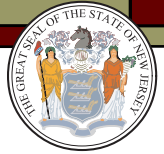

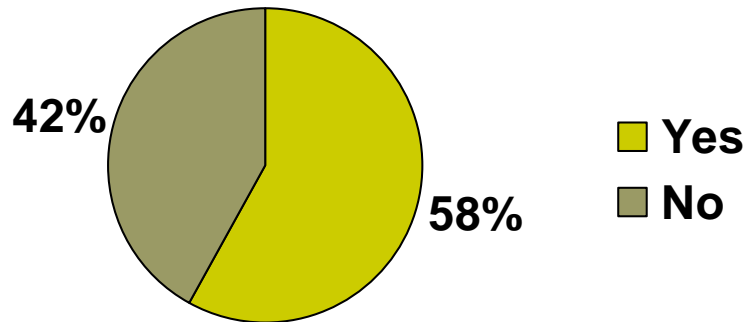
What would make the CPEP “In-Home” Program more attractive to you as a provider? (Provider not planning on participating.)

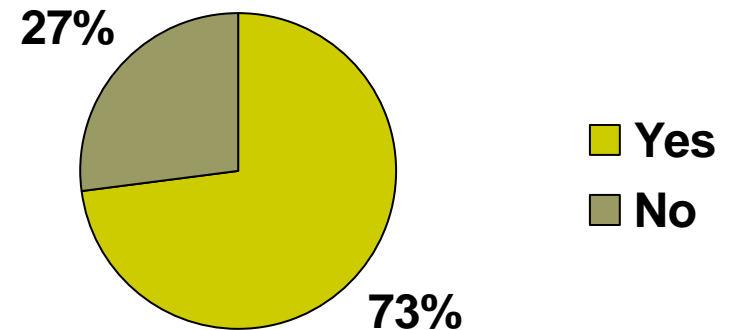


CPEP "Out-of-Home" Participation

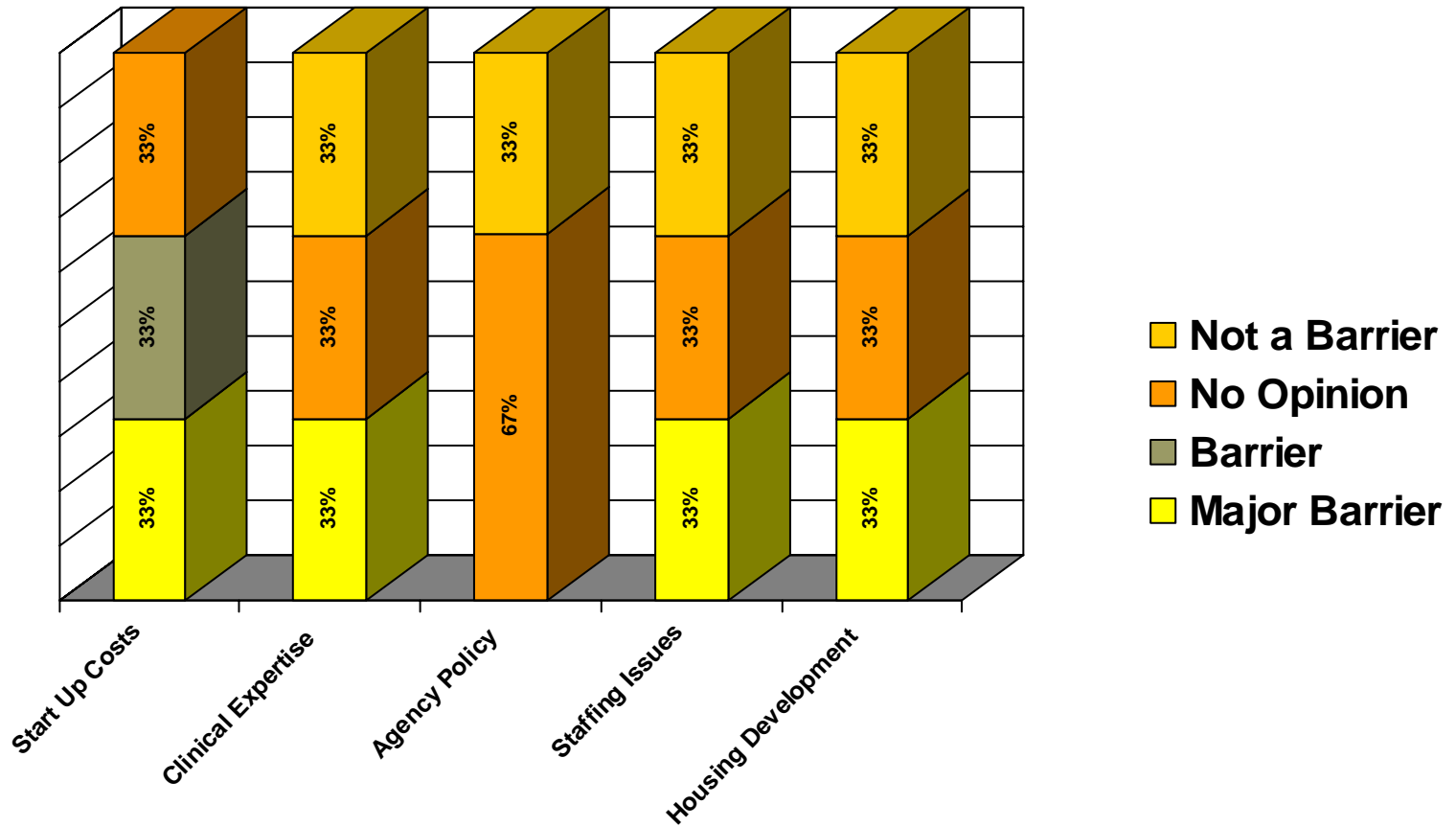


Is your agency planning to participate in the CPEP "Out-of-Home" Program?

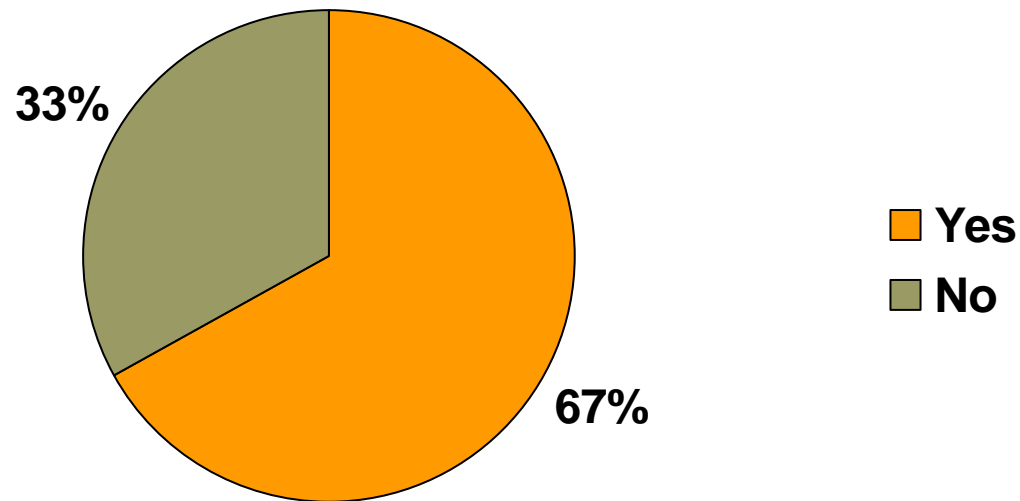

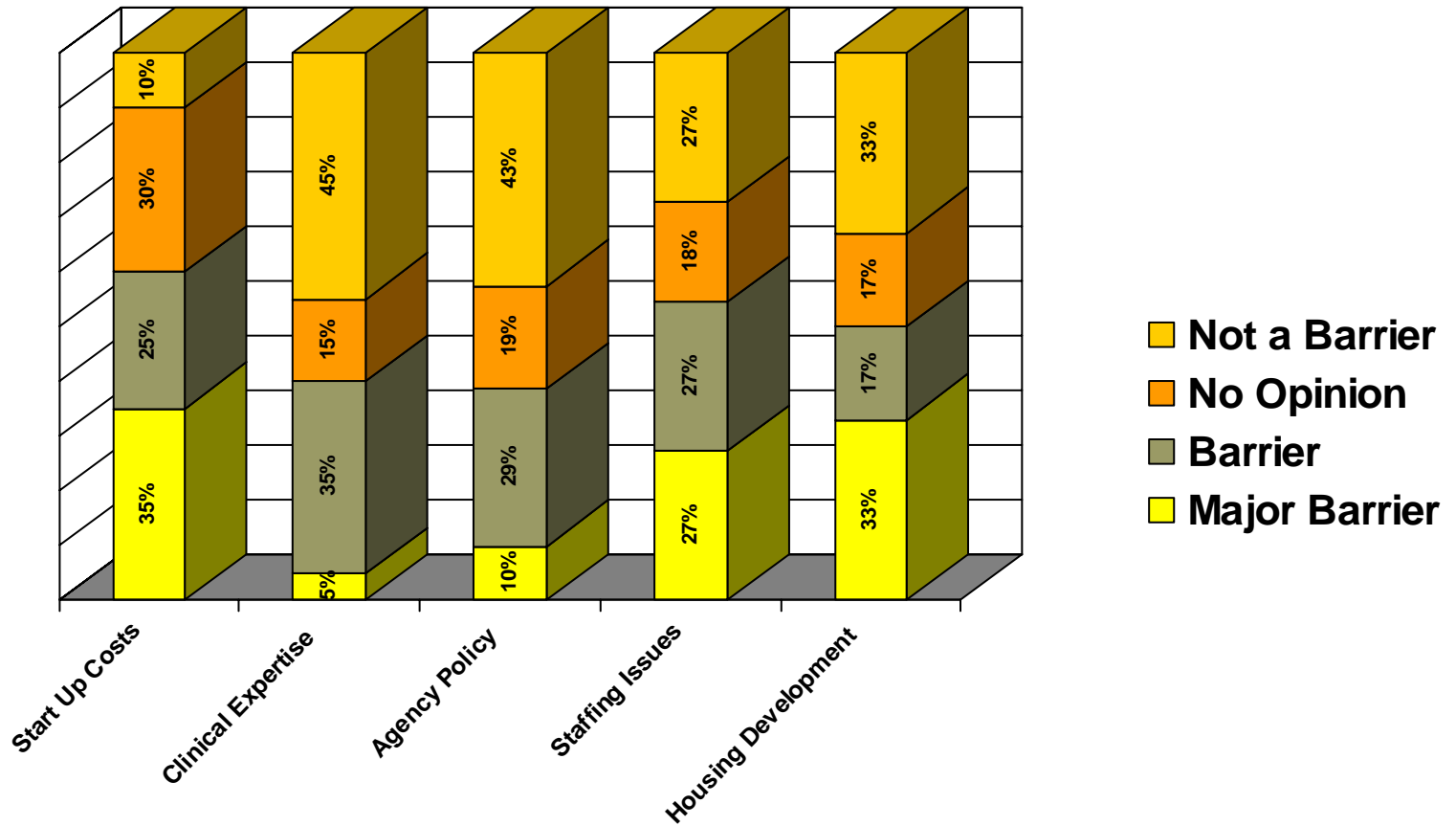

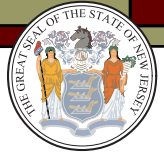
Training Improvements

- ❑ More Boggs Training
- ❑ Have Required Trainings more frequently
- ❑ Simplify CPEP trainings
- ❑ Providers should have ability to train own staff in house
- ❑ Make training process more flexible
- ❑ Service Coordinators and Case Management need training on CPEP Process and P&P's
- ❑ Boggs and PCT training should be offered in one place and by one agency and it should be offered more often



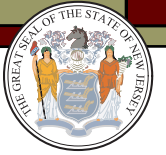
Develop Best Practices

- What's working/ what's not



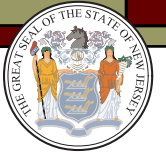
Process Improvement

- ❑ In home process is inefficient and lacks clarity seems that information that is needed is not asked for until we do not provide it
- ❑ One Centralized point person/contact~ too many people/parties involved in the process
- ❑ Eliminate Case Manager or Support Coordinator
- ❑ Someone available to walk agencies through the CPEP process
- ❑ Develop a clearer description of how CPEP works; write clear standards and guidelines



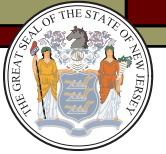
Process Improvement continued.....

- ❑ Work with providers to define services that are needed/required and how to obtain them.
- ❑ Allow Stand Alone providers to subcontract from CPEP residential providers
- ❑ Access to groups of individuals needed to develop supports and services
- ❑ Licensing process #1 barrier- takes too long. DDD needs to expedite the Licensing process.
- ❑ A faster process for getting policy manuals approved.
- ❑ Decrease bureaucracy



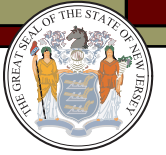
Budget Improvements

- DDD rate too low for behaviors- need enhanced staff
Talk with provides about making sure the budgets for CPEP program can fiscally stand alone
- Improve budgeting mechanism so that services aren't divided evenly by month since different amount are need at different times of year.
- Allowing at least 4 youth in a residential setting
- Need groups of people to serve...not fiscally feasible to do one at a time and hope to get sufficient referrals to offset costs involved in this type of business



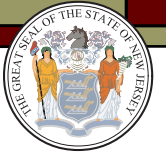
Budget Improvements continued.....

- Provide start up consultant costs to get manuals complete and application to be approved
- Increased funds to pay for salaries of professional staff to work in such programs.
- Adequate compensation for suitable employees and housing



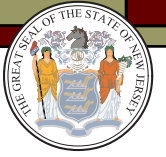
Recruitment

- Approach agencies with experience and competencies working with children and challenging behaviors and encourage them to consider developing programs.
- Availability of suitable employees and housing

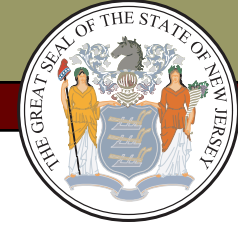


Agency Specific Improvements

- Agency Board of Trustees would need to agree to this shift in agency services.



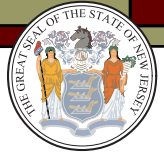

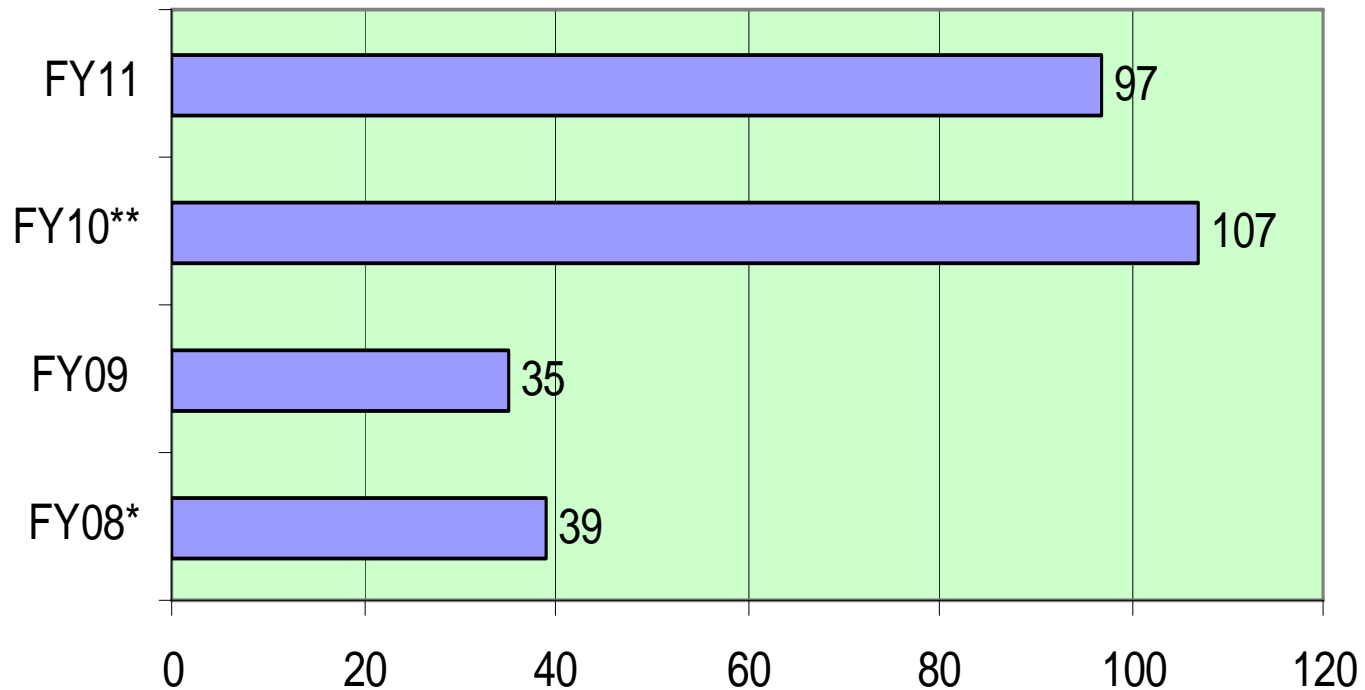
Children's Placement Enhancement Project (CPEP) Overview

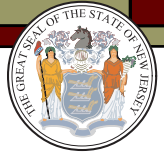

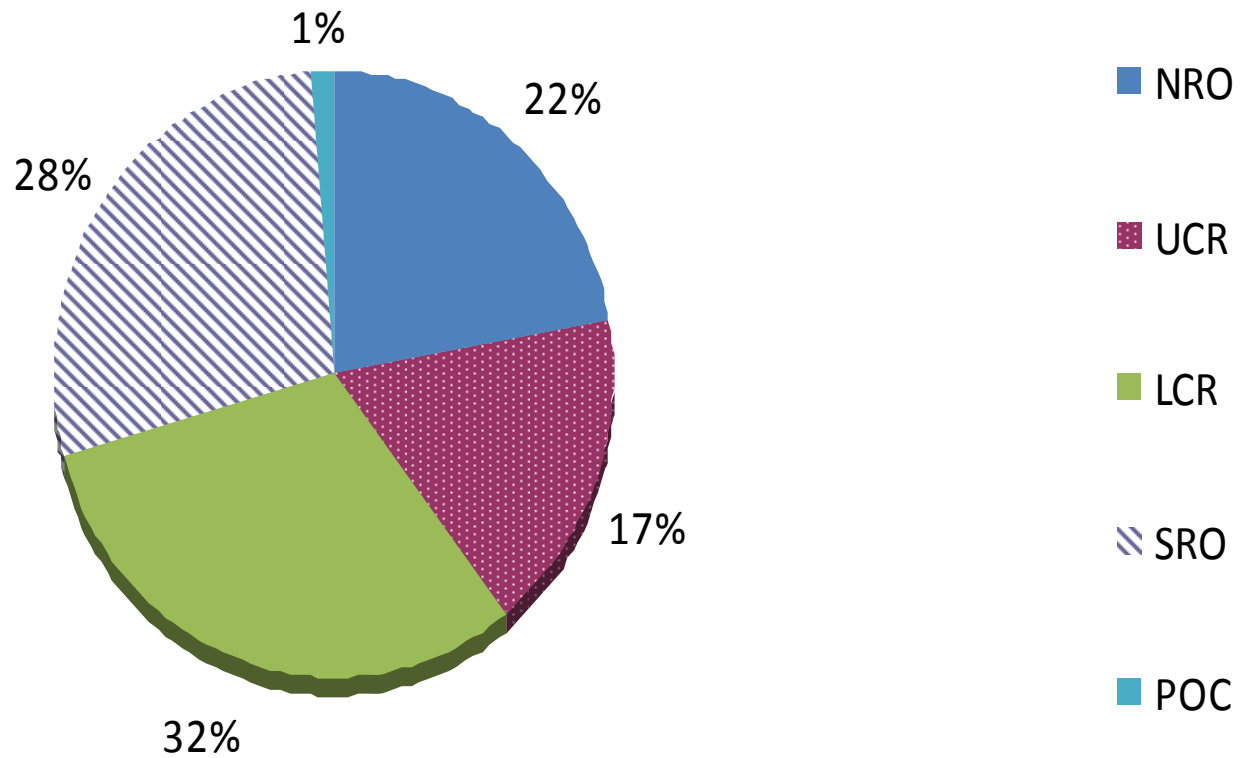

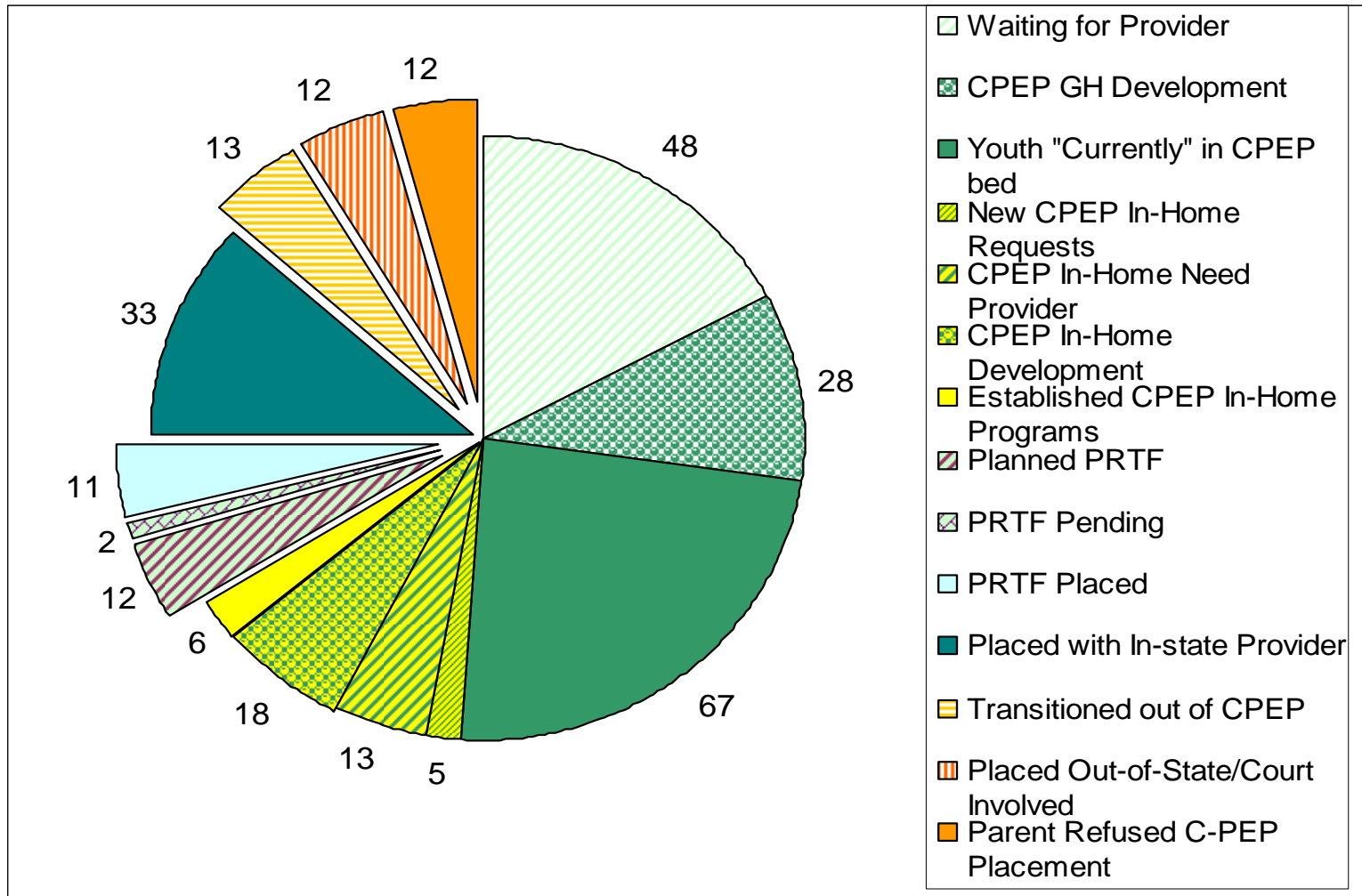
CPEP Emergency Requests/Referrals by Year

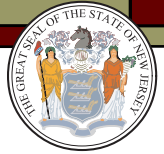




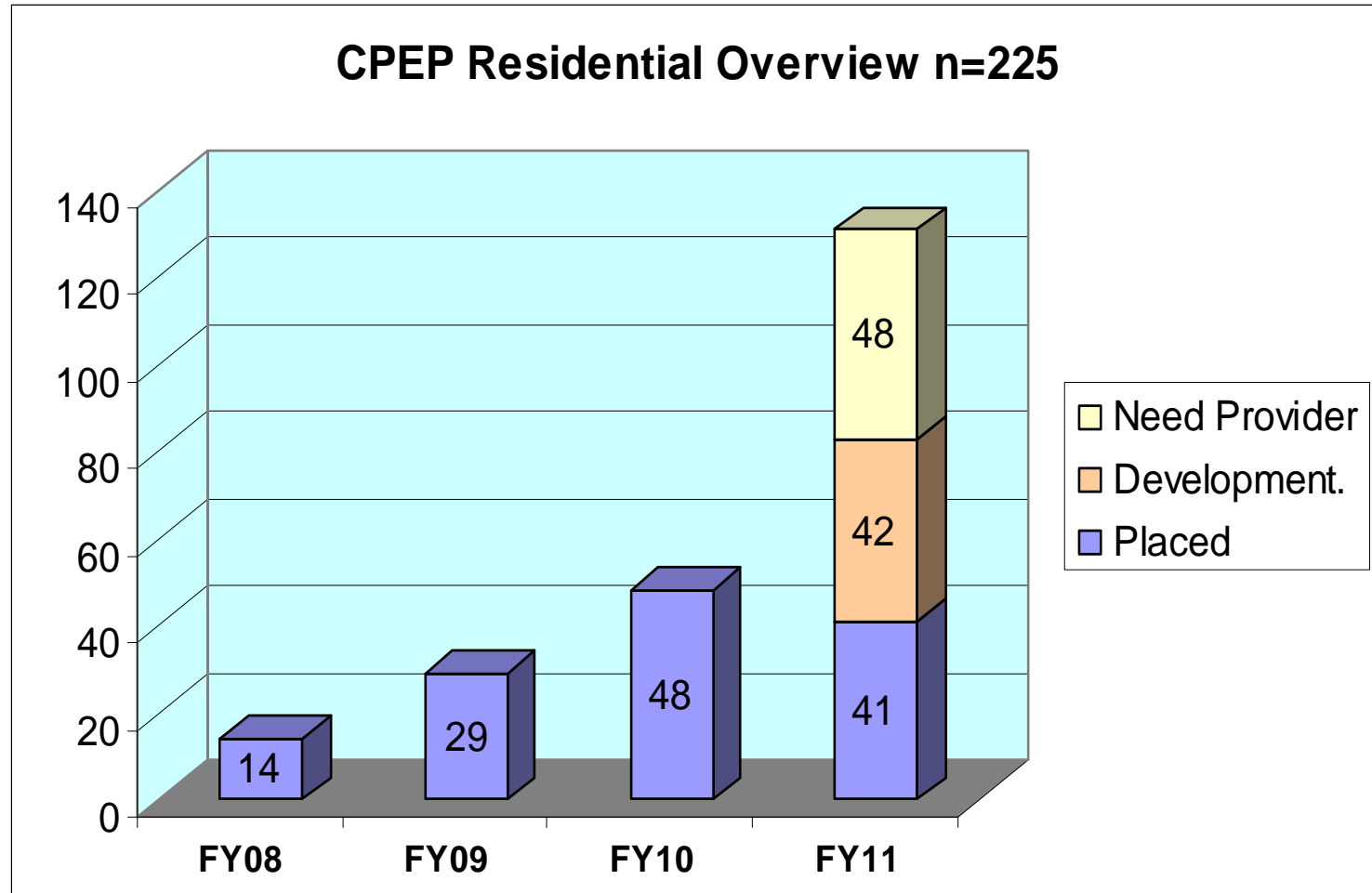
FY 08-FY11 Requests for Emergency Placement by Region

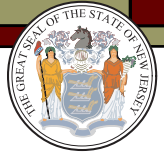






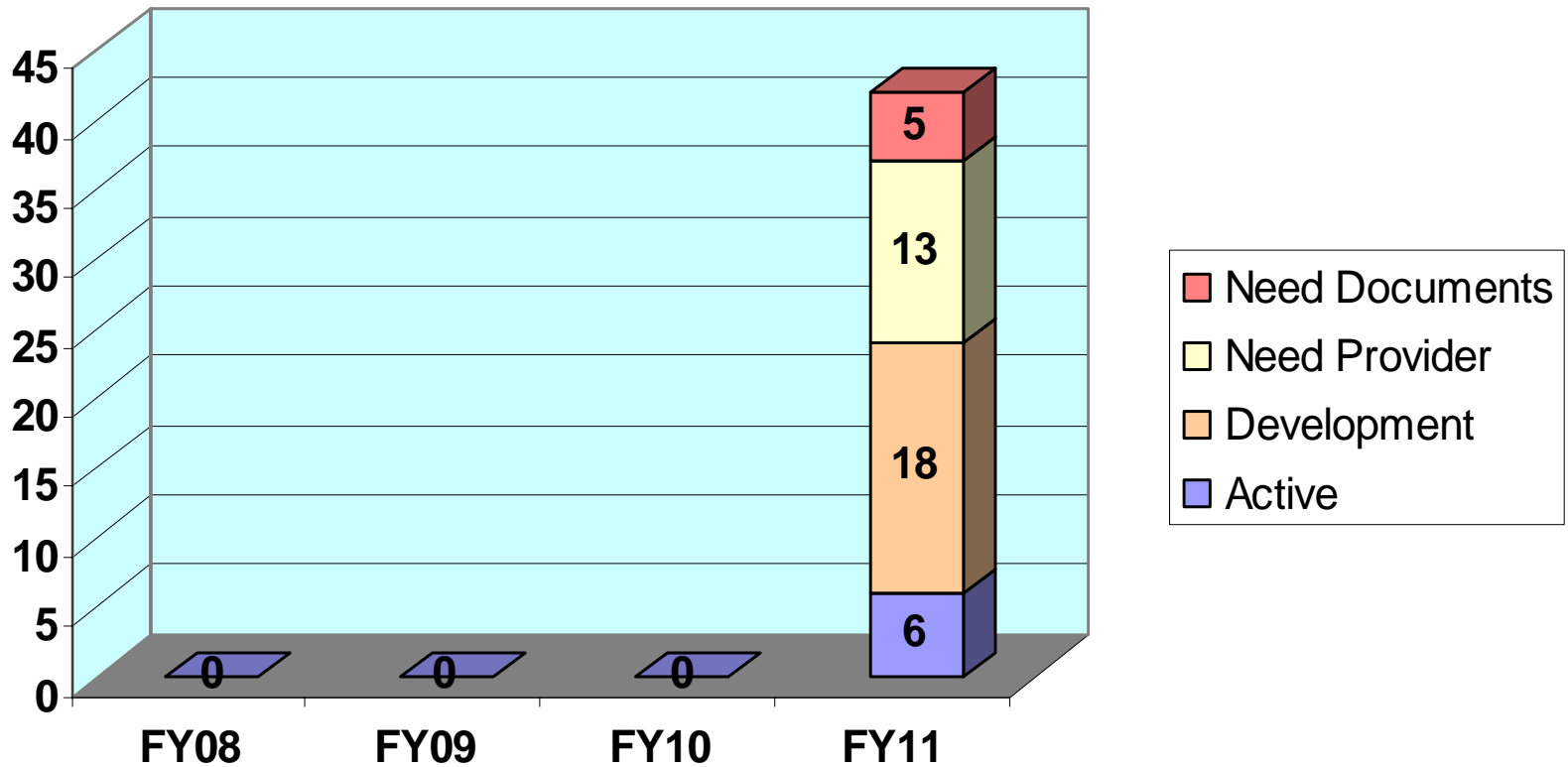

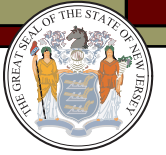




Children's Placement Enhancement Project (CPEP)

57 agencies are qualified to work with CPEP In-Home

Breakdown

32 are qualified to work with Medical level 1-6 and Behavior level 1-4

11 are qualified to work with Medical level 1-2 and Behavior level 1-4

14 are qualified to work with Medical level 1-6 and Behavior level 1-2

The number of agencies would be 70 if we included the 13 agencies qualified to work with Medical level 1-2 and Behavior level 1-2 (not generally used)
