



North Jersey Developmental Center Fact Sheet

- North Jersey Developmental Center (NJDC) is one of seven developmental centers operated by the New Jersey Department of Human Services' Division of Developmental Disabilities.
- NJDC is located on 188 acres in Totowa, Passaic County, New Jersey.
- The Center was established in 1928 and was known as the "North Jersey Training School" until July 1983.
- As of February 21, 2014, the NJDC census was 174 men and women.
- As of January 1, 2014, NJDC employed 908 full time staff, 92 part time staff and 83 temporary staff. About half of the full time employees are Direct Care Staff.
- 36% of NJDC residents are between the ages of 22 and 45; 52% are between the ages of 46 and 64; and 12% are 65 or older.
- 49% of the individuals who reside at NJDC have profound intellectual disabilities; 21% have severe intellectual disabilities; and 30% have been assessed with mild and moderate levels of intellectual disability.
- 74% of individuals are ambulatory; and 26% are either non-ambulatory or require assistance with ambulation.
- There are 35 buildings located on the campus, 11 of which contain different living areas.
- The largest census at NJDC was in 1984 when 661 individuals were served at the facility.
- North Jersey Developmental Center will be closed on July 1, 2014.
